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**Notes:**  
1/ The intent of the proposed legislation is to abolish the Guam Land Use Commission (GLUC) and transfer its mandates and responsibilities to the Governor of Guam for a period of one year. Per its enabling act (§60401, Article 4, Chapter 60, Title 21, Guam Code Annotated), the GLUC is comprised of a total of five members. Per §43104, Chapter 43, Title 5 Guam Code Annotated, any member of a board or commission shall be compensated in the amount of \$50 for attending a board or commission meeting, with such compensation not to exceed \$100 per month.

Should the subject legislation become law, abolishing the GLUC and transferring its duties to the Governor of Guam will result in the Department of Land Management (DLM) not being required to make stipend payments to GLUC members for a period of one year. The DLM currently funds the GLUC and Guam Seashore Protection Commission's stipend payments from its Land Survey Revolving Fund. The projected cost savings, assuming GLUC conducts two (2) meetings per month, is approximately \$6,000.
