Dear Senator Perez:

The Office of Public Accountability (OPA) supports Bill 33-36. We appreciate the proactive approach to addressing our concerns in our recent audit issued in December 2020, OPA Report No. 20-09 *Government of Guam Procurement Training and Certification Program Follow-Up Audit*. The report is available on our website at www.opaguam.org.

The Guam Procurement Law prohibits the participation of government personnel who have not obtained the mandated procurement training and certification. It is necessary to produce employees who are knowledgeable in procurement to effectively and efficiently perform their agency procurement functions. In OPA Report No 20-09, we found that agencies are continuing to work on complying with the procurement training and certification requirements. However, other than OPA's compliance audits, there is no entity monitoring agency compliance with the procurement training.

The Guam Community College is only mandated to establish and administer the program. While they maintain a database of individuals who have completed the procurement training modules, they are not solely responsible for determining program compliance. Until such time an entity is established to determine program compliance, OPA is willing to assist with monitoring compliance by having the agencies submit a report annually to OPA 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, summarizing its employees (those responsible with procurement) compliance with the procurement training, in line with Bill 33-36.



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We suggest the Procurement Training Compliance report that will be submitted by the agencies should have at a minimum the list of employees by name, their job titles, and each procurement training module they've completed, and the date of completion.

We also suggest a clarification to the title of the bill to include "Training" between "Procurement" and "Compliance" to read "Relative to Agencies Submitting a Procurement Training Compliance Report to the Office of Public Accountability". This should also be reflected on line 11 on page 1 and lines 2 to 3, 9, and 11 on page 2, to say "Procurement Training Compliance Report"

COMMITTEE REPORT DIGEST

I. OVERVIEW

Bill No. 33-36 (COR) was introduced on January 19, 2021 by Senator Sabina Flores Perez and was subsequently referred by the Committee on Rules to the Committee on Environment, Revenue and Taxation, Labor, Procurement, and Statistics, Research, and Planning on January 20, 2021.

The Committee on Environment, Revenue and Taxation, Labor, Procurement, and Statistics, Research, and Planning convened a virtual public hearing on Bill No. 33-36 (COR) on Friday, February 5, 2021 at 1:00 PM via Zoom Video Conference Platform.

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 1:00 PM.

Chairperson Perez: Just to go over the rules of conduct for the virtual public hearing: the host of this hearing will mute all participants until called upon by the Chair. Virtual background should not be utilized during public hearing. When called to speak please remember to unmute yourself. The Chairperson will open the floor to members wishing to pose questions to any individuals. Individuals testifying shall first be recognized by the Chair before speaking and shall state their name for record keeping purposes and all questions shall be confined to the substance and nature of the agenda. Personal inference as to character or motive of Senator any individual testifying is not permitted and any violations of this rule will result in removal from the public hearing by the host.

Next item on the agenda to hear public testimony regarding Bill No. 33-36 (COR), a bill sponsored by myself Senator Sabina Flores Perez, is an act to add a new section 5141(n) to Chapter 5, Title 5 and to add a new section 1924 to Chapter 19, Title 1 both of Guam Code Annotated, relative to the agency submitting a procurement compliance report to the Office of Public Accountability. Just to give you some opening remarks, what Bill 33-86 would do, it would require agencies to submit a compliance report to the Office of Public Accountability in an effort to ensure adequate

staffing of qualified professionals handling procurement at the agency level and to help streamline government of Guam operations, improve efficiency and ensure accountability and transparency in the expenditure of government funds. Currently there is no monitoring agency to ensure procurement training compliance. Bill 33-36 seeks to address this by mandating the submission of the report to the Office of Public Accountability summarizing procurement training compliance of employees responsible for procurement. The bill follows a report by OPA which identified a need for more GovGuam employees to become proficient in procurement laws and practices in order to reduce the number of protests and appeals. Ensuring that personnel handling procurements are properly trained, Bill 33-36 makes certain that the people of Guam will receive much-needed goods, services, construction projects in a timely and efficient manner. With Bill 33-36, agencies will not only comply with the law and obtaining procurement training for employees responsible for purchasing but that they must also maintain that compliance. Bill 33-36 will enable larger, more complex contracts to be delivered by qualified and experienced procurement professionals. I would like to thank Public Auditor BJ Cruz for his willingness to serve as a monitoring agency, on top of the office's other duties.

I'm open to the dialogue and as of now we are going to receive testimonies. I believe we have Attorney Brown here today; we also receive written testimony from the Public Auditor. We do have somebody from the Public Auditor's office who is also willing to present their testimony. Attorney brown did you want to present testimony regarding this?

Attorney John Brown, *Attorney-at-Law*: I'd like to congratulate you for taking this up and the Public Auditor for bringing forward such a bill. Procurement training is an essential item that we don't have enough of. It came about actually from an article I wrote on that in Guam Business Magazine 10 years ago maybe. I had begun teaching procurement training at GCC just because I thought it needed to be done. When that article came to BJ's attention, he wrote the law and it's very well designed. It needs to be implemented. It is being implemented; I have to say. One of the nice things about having this is you'll find some of the weak spots in it, when the reports are made but the other nice thing to know about it... BJ has some statistics that he was giving me about how effective this training is becoming. In the years before people started taking the classes because they had to, we were getting procurement appeals to OPA at the rate of 20 to 30 a year. Since the classes have been, were generously attended, in fact full classes, we've had for the last couple years, it's dropped down to about 8 to 10 procurement appeals a year. People are learning how to do it better and that's what we want to do but we need to constantly train because people roll over. They change jobs and all that stuff as we do. It's an ongoing thing and you need ongoing monitoring of it, and this will be a very valuable addition to the process.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you so much for your support and for your testimony. The next person on the list is Jerrick Hernandez from the Office of Public Accountability. Thank you Jerrick for taking the time out of your busy schedule. I know you have a lot of reports to do. I appreciate your time, spending the time here. You have the floor when you're ready.

Jerrick Hernandez, *Auditor, Office of Public Accountability*: Thank you so much Senator Perez and we also like to thank you for your continuous support of the office and in particular the procurement, any procurement recommendations we have you've been very supportive of us in that endeavor. We did already submit a written testimony, but I will just read it for the record.

Dear Senator Perez, the Office of Public Accountability supports Bill 33-36. We appreciate the proactive approach to addressing our concerns and our recent audit issued in December 2020, OPA report number 20-09 *Government of Guam Procurement Training and Certification Program Follow-Up Audit*. This report is also available on our website at www.opa.guam.org. The Guam Procurement Law prohibits the participation of government personnel who have not obtained the mandated procurement training and certification. It is necessary to produce employees who are knowledgeable in procurement to effectively and efficiently perform their agency procurement functions. In OPA Report No. 20-09, we found that agencies are continuing to work on complying with the procurement training and certification requirements. However, other than OPA's compliance audits, there is no entity monitoring agency compliance with the procurement training.

The Guam Community College is only mandated to establish and administer the program. While they maintain a database of individuals who have completed the program training modules, they're not solely responsible for determining program compliance. Until such time an entity is established to determine program compliance, OPA is willing to assist with monitoring compliance by having the agency submit a report annually to OPA 30 days after the end of each fiscal year, summarizing its employees (those who are responsible with procurement) compliance with the procurement training, in line with Bill 33-36.

We do have some suggestions which we note. We suggest that the procurement training compliance report that will be mandated by the agency should have a minimum of the list of the employees by name, their job titles, and each procurement training module, they've completed, and the date of completion. In addition, we also suggest a clarification to the title of the bill to include training between procurement and compliance to read relative to agencies submitting a procurement training compliance report to the Office of Public Accountability. This should also be reflected on line 11, on page 1 and lines 2 to 3, 9 and 11, on page 2 to say, "procurement training compliance report." Just to add emphasis that it's a procurement training compliance and not just procurement in general and other than that if you have any questions feel free to contact me regarding the recommendation.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you so much Jerrick. We appreciate you taking the time and now I think it's pretty clear, so we'll definitely make those changes to the bill in the committee report. We did reach out to General Service Agency, Chief Procurement Officer, Claudia Acfalle for their input regarding this bill and we will continue to seek their input. I don't have any questions to the panel but thank you so much for being here and providing testimony. I would like to offer the floor to my colleagues that are here today. Speaker Therese if you would like to, if you have any questions for the panel.

Speaker Terlaje: Thank you if I could just ask, I know we received the OPA's report and that's very helpful but this training of Directors, when the Directors change, in my view quite often. I mean is that necessary, that the directors are also trained, are they considered procurement personnel, purchasing personnel or should we be met... I know they try to do line staff as well. I mean what do you call it, classifieds staff as well but I don't know... What is your opinion on getting the Director certified? Are they also signing off and they need to be trained in all four modules?

Chairperson Perez: I would like to defer to either professor or the Public Auditor but I would say yes but I would like to hear their responses too. Maybe Attorney Brown?

Attorney Brown: Thanks for the question Speaker because it's vital. Good procurement starts at the top because the people down below and I get it from students all the time, don't know what they're doing and when they do learn, they get squelched by the people above, who don't know what they're supposed to be doing. I think besides which the head of the agency, for those agencies that have procurement authority, their name is on it and they're out, they deal with the protests. I mean they're the ones behind the eight ball, if they don't know what they're doing, they're going to make it worse and they don't set a very good example from those below them. I've seen a number of Directors come through the program. The absence of the others is noticeable too, but I've never had anybody tell me it was a waste of time.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you. Jerrick, did you want to provide any additional support or information?

Mr. Hernandez: I agree with Attorney Brown's assessment and I just wanted to add that sometimes a lot of the these appointed, these politically appointed Directors and oftentimes they come from the private sector and often they kind of just don't know Guam procurement and they can oftentimes think they can just do whatever but in line, when they get to the actual Guam procurement law, they can't just do whatever. I think it's very important that they do get the training in all four modules, especially like Attorney Brown had pointed out that they do oversee the whole agency and all the purchasing. That's actually one of the reasons why we did the follow-up audit. We knew there was a change in administration and the Public Auditor felt like he wanted to see if there is at least, there's some that the new administration and the appointed, newly appointed cabinet members are actually trying to get the training and that's why we did the follow-up audit and we released that last year.

Speaker Terlaje: If you can remind us, what is the reason then if only 13 Directors out of the 50 line agencies obtain module 1 certification and only 1 obtaining certification in all four modules? Is the procurement being done by someone else in these cases or is that allowed by law, that with only one module they sign off on the procurement or... I don't see any penalty, I guess, or I thought that by requiring the training we were saying you can't sign off unless you've been trained but is that not the case?

Mr. Hernandez: For the line agencies in particular this sort of saving grace and we noted in the report, that they technically all still go through GSA and at least the CPO herself has taken and most of the current staff, or well I wouldn't say most because a lot of them have left but what the key members that do sign off, particularly the CPO has taken all four modules. With regards to the autonomous agencies that do handle their own procurement, the saving grace again is that if the head is not fully certified, they have a Deputy or Chief Procurement Officer in their agency that has taken all four modules. There is some form of safety net for those that haven't taken it yet.

Speaker Terlaje: Thank you Madam Chair.

Chairperson Perez: Thank you Speaker Terlaje. I just also want to reiterate that this is all about building capacity too, as well and it would help streamline the procurement operations because what we're hearing from many businesses out there is, they go through the agency and then they think they got a deal and then later on they find out they have to go through GSA and go through the whole process all over again. By following up on this it hopefully would promote more trained professionals within our government agencies so that it could be handled quicker. The other thing is the RFP process, so that's supposed to be handled by the agency so that's something to be questioned, is who's handling these RFP's at the agency level, if they don't have the procurement training there. The Director for sure but they need a panel of people to vote on this. I mean unless the Chief Procurement Officer is handling all of the RFPs from all the line agencies and that again creates that bottleneck which is why procurement is delayed potentially because it's going to one agency, when in fact it could be, the load could be spread probably perhaps better around the agencies. I'm really happy to see that the Public Auditor is willing to kind of monitor this and maybe we can increase the capacity within our line agencies and government overall. Thank you for those good questions. Are there any Senators that would like to provide any questions or comments at this time? I think that concludes the hearing for Bill 33-36. We will continue to receive testimony till February 11, 4pm for this bill and anything that was heard today. Thank you so much Jerrick and thank you Attorney Brown for your time.

Chairperson Perez adjourned the public hearing for Bill No. 33-36 (COR) at 1:45 p.m.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATION

- Clarification to the title of the bill to include "Training" between "Procurement" and "Compliance" to read "Relative to Agencies Submitting a Procurement Training Compliance Report to the Office of Public Accountability". This should also be reflected on line 11 on page 1 and lines 2 to 3, 9, and 11 on page 2, to say "Procurement Training Compliance Report".

GSA had the following comments:

- How long is the information to be kept active?

- Should that information be provided to the agencies who are hiring for buyer positions to show their qualifications?

The Bureau requests that Bill No. 33-36 (COR) be granted a waiver pursuant to Public Law 12-229, as amended for the following reason(s):

BILL NO. 33-36 (COR) IS AN ACT TO ADD A NEW § 5141(n) to CHAPTER 5, TITLE 5, AND TO ADD A NEW §1924 TO CHAPTER 19, TITLE 1, BOTH OF GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO AGENCIES SUBMITTING A PROCUREMENT COMPLIANCE REPORT TO THE OFFICE OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTABILITY."

Bill No.33-36 (COR) proposes the establishment of a timeline for the submission of a Procurement Compliance Report, which would require all heads of agencies, inclusive of line agencies, autonomous and semi-autonomous agencies, public corporations, the Guam Mayor's Council, the Courts of the Judiciary of Guam, and the Legislature to submit a Procurement Compliance Report, no later than thirty (30) days after then end of each Fiscal Year via email, in Portable Document Format (PDF), to the Office of Public Accountability.

Further, the proposed legislation specifies that the Public Auditor shall receive and maintain a Procurement Compliance Report in PDF format. The Procurement Compliance Report shall detail the procurement training compliance received by the employee charged with the responsibility of procurement for their respective agency or entity of the Government of Guam.

As such, the Bill is administrative in nature and poses no fiscal impact upon any funds of the Government of Guam.
