



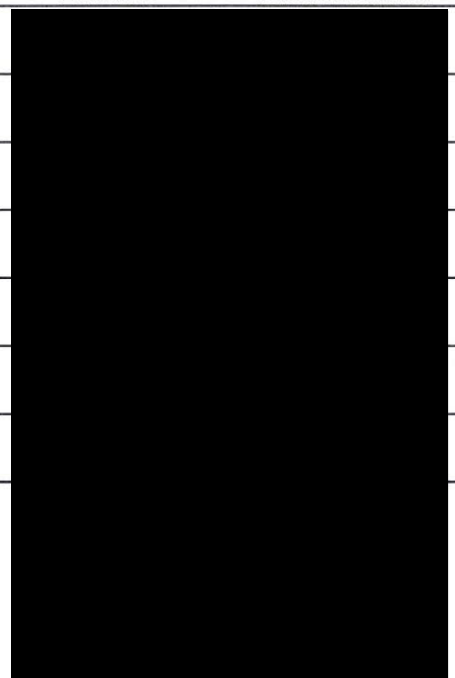

Good afternoon and Hafa Adai, Madam Chairwoman Senator Amanda Shelton and members of this esteemed committee. I am Rosie Rivera Tainatongo, and I am honored and privileged to be before you today. At my last confirmation hearing on May 9, 2019, I accepted the nomination to be a member of the Board of Directors for the A.B. Won Pat International Guam Airport Authority (GIAA). Upon confirmation by the Guam Legislature and after being sworn in, I began my work with much enthusiasm. I want to thank the other Board members, Chairman Brian Bamba; Vice-Chairman Bic Solti; Secretary Donald Weakley, Directors Lucy Alcorn, Doyon Ahn Moroto and Jesse Garcia for participating collaboratively in active dialogue to move the vision and the mission of GIAA forward.

I am here today to express my interest and desire to continue my public service for our government and our island community. I especially thank Honorable Governor Lou Leon Guerrero for having the trust and confidence to re-appoint me to the GIAA Board. Chairwoman Senator Shelton and Senators, despite setbacks on our aviation dynamics by COVID-19 which severely impacted Guam's tourism industry, the GIAA Board and its management team led by Executive Manager John Quinata and Deputy Executive Manager, Dr. Artemio Hernandez pursued all possible options and developed strategies and platforms to sustain airport operations with the support of our hard working and dedicated 3,784 employees in our workforce. In the interest of time, I have provided a list of our accomplishments in Airport Finance, Capital Improvement Projects, Passenger Service, Safety & Security, Regulatory Matters, and Air Service Development along with highlights from our Citizen Centric Report (CCR).

GIAA CHALLENGES

As our Airport continues to evolve, GIAA faces unique challenges as outlined in its CCR in recovering traffic from cities originating from two key markets - Japan and South Korea. In FY 2023, the value of the Japanese Yen was at its weakest level since the 1990's making Guam a more expensive destination compared to other comparable Asian vacation destinations.

Recognizing this issue, GIAA is challenged with encouraging other airlines to include Guam as one of its destinations.

PUBLIC SERVICE

My journey in public service, Madam chair and Senators, involves membership in many boards and commissions. My ultimate goal remains to do good for the people of Guam in the area of air transportation services. Most of you associate my work in the education industry with over four decades of experience as illustrated in my resume provided to your committee. My leadership had been a part of overseeing a critical government agency, Managing and Supervising approximately 4,000 employees at the Department of Education, approximately 33,000 students then, 38 schools and several major divisions. The DOE Department during my tenure, operated over \$130 million in local appropriation and approximately 67 million in DOD funds for the Department of Education. I will continue to work with an attitude of collaborative framework. I want to take this opportunity to also thank my family for the years of supporting me in all my public service endeavors and for allowing me to continue to serve our Government and Our island community.

AIRPORT FINANCE

1) \$21.4 Million for Terminal Roofing System Award – March 2024

GIAA was awarded \$21.4 Million in Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) competence grant funding toward replacing its terminal roofing system, which is focused on installing a modern energy-efficient roofing system integrated with renewable energy solutions such as solar panels.

2) \$31.3 Million for Terminal Apron & Taxiway Rehabilitation – March 2024

Under a competitive grant with FAA, GIAA was awarded \$31.3 Million for this Project, which improved the safety of aircraft parking and taxiway areas. A groundbreaking ceremony was held on March 29, 2024, on the apron area overlooking Route 10A.

3) \$500,000 for Energy Efficient Assessment – April 2024

FAA awarded GIAA \$500,000 to conduct an energy efficiency assessment for the Main Terminal building to identify measures to improve usage and reduce costs. This grant is a 90/10 cost share between FAA and GIAA.

4) \$10.6 Million for the Rehabilitation of Terminal Apron – (September 2024)

GIAA was awarded an additional \$10.6 Million to rehabilitate the Terminal Apron and to complete the funding needed for the full Terminal Apron Rehab Project.

5) \$21.4 Million for Phase I Roof Replacement w/Solar Module Racking – September 2024

FAA awarded GIAA \$21.4 Million for replacement of the roof membrane for the Terminal building to include solar panel racking system on which to install solar panels for energy efficiency.

AIRPORT FACILITIES (NEW)

6) \$41 Million Apron & Taxiway Rehabilitation – March 2024

This project is 90% funded through FAA supplemental funding and funds allocated under the 2022 Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and broke ground on March 29, 2024. The project includes rehabilitating approximately 1.5 million square feet (150,000 square yards) of the parking/apron area and Kilo taxiway in front of the Terminal and airfield – enabling ground support equipment operations, personnel activities, passenger movements and airport servicing.

PASSENGER SERVICE ENHANCEMENTS

7) Public Parking Lot Improvements

A new payment system is in place that provides new technology and convenience for consumers which allows for payment on mobile phones that support credit cards, direct bank transfers, Pay Pal, Google Wallet and Apple Pay. New pay stations are also available at the Arrivals Lobby and the basement level entry from the public parking lot.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

8) Airport Cybersecurity Training – January 2024

A successful cohort of 36 participants from GIAA, GovGuam Agencies and regional airports completed this comprehensive course, which included classroom, and practical to assess cybersecurity threats present in the operational systems in play, and training to mitigate/resolve these risks. A collaborative network with GIAA includes the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), the FAA, the Office of Information and Technology Services and their cybersecurity training partners – Airports Council International (ACI) and the Idaho National Laboratory (INL) sponsored the one- week long comprehensive Airport Cybersecurity Course.

9) Active Shooter Training (New Project) – August 2024

The Airport Police conducted the Active Shooter Training for all GIAA employees. The goal of the program is to equip individuals in the workplace to respond to a violent critical incident with confidence. Participating employees are now aware of the response techniques (Run, Hide, Fight) and how to employ them giving them the confidence to handle a possible incident.

REGULATORY

10) FAA Commends GIAA as First Regional Airport with SMS Implementation Plan – September 2024

GIAA was recognized as the first airport in the region to receive approval of its Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) required Safety Management System (SMS) – the first step in complying with FAA’s ongoing transition to a more streamlined and performance- based regulatory framework.

11) US Customs and Border Protection (USCBP) – Common Use Terminal Equipment Operators (CUTE) Biometric and Exit System

Activation of the biometric exist system makes Guam the first US airport in the region to implement technology in conformance to the USCBP requirements. The system is installed at the passenger gates and is used by the airlines capturing biometric exit of all departing passengers since October 1, 2023.

AIR SERVICE

In FY 2023, the total number of passenger movements reached 1,629,183, more than twice the activity in FY 2022 of 745,717 movements. Enplanements (departing and transit passengers), constituting 882,664 movements, represented 54.2% of the overall traffic, while arriving passengers comprised 45.8%. In terms of ramp activity, the GIAA managed 27,602 aircraft movements versus 18,756 movements the prior year and Airline partners transported over 10,536 metric tons of cargo and 12,969 metric tons of mail in FY 2023.

12) JAL Resumes 5x Weekly Service – April 2024

This Japan Air Lines 5x Weekly Service was launched after measured, interim 1x to 3x weekly post COVID-19 pandemic operations.

13) UAL Haneda-Guam Route – May 2024

United Air Lines Haneda-Guam route began on May 1, 2024, and increased UAL’s hub activity from Guam of more than 87 flights weekly to 14 destinations and adds to the 32 flights currently operating from Guam to Narita Tokyo. This new route is significant in Guam’s history as the first direct connection to the heart of Tokyo city and greatly enhances Guam as a convenient and preferred destination, joining UAL’s direct service from Haneda to Newark, New York, Washington, D.C., Chicago, Los Angeles and San

Francisco.

GIAA FY2023 CITIZEN CENTRIC REPORT (CCR)

On August 23, 2024, GIAA filed its FY2023 Citizen Centric Report (CCR) with the Office of Public Accountability. Below is an excerpt showing GIAA's FY 2023 FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE.

AIRPORT REVENUES

The GIAA's operating revenues increased in FY 2023 by \$7M, going from \$33.2M in FY 2022 to \$40.2M in FY 2023. The largest increase was from facilities and systems usage charges, which increased by \$13.5M followed by rental income, which increased by \$1.6M. The decline in concession fees is mainly due to the accounting adjustment attributable to the application of Government Accounting Standards Board Statement No. 87, Leases, and the associated effect of the COVID-19 rent relief, which decreased concession revenues by \$8.0M in FY 2023 in contrast to the increased concession revenues of \$4.8M in FY 2022.

AIRPORT EXPENSES

Total operating expenses for FY 2023 increased by \$7.8M, going from \$39.2M in FY 2022 to \$47M in FY 2023. The increase in personnel was primarily due to a \$3.1M increase in retirement contributions due to the year-end pension adjustment to align with GovGuam Retirement Fund's actuarial report. The \$4.6M increase in contractual services was attributed to various factors, including a \$1.8M rise in power utility rates, a \$1.5M arbitrage accrual, a \$608K increase in repairs and maintenance, and other contractual increases needed to maintain operations during the fiscal year due to passenger activity doubling from the prior fiscal year.

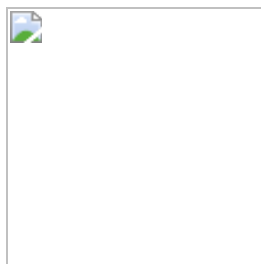

II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 2:00 p.m.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Buenas and Hafa Adai everyone. This public hearing by the Committee on Maritime & Air Transportation, Parks, Tourism, Higher Education, and the Advancement of Women, Youth, and Senior Citizens is hereby called to order.

Today is Monday, November 25, 2024, and the time now is 2:00 p.m. For the record and in accordance with the open government law, notices for this hearing were sent on November 18th and again on November 20th. In addition, this hearing was noticed on the Guam Legislature website and the Guam Public Notice Website.

Thank you to my Vice-Chair, Senator Jesse Lujan, for joining me here this afternoon.

Before we proceed with the discussion, I'd like to first provide everyone with some of the general rules of conduct for those in attendance. The conduct of this hearing shall be as follows: Written testimonies shall be submitted to the committee.

Please provide my Legislative staff with your written testimony for photocopying. Testimony may be read, and lengthy testimony should be summarized to about five (5) minutes. Those testifying will be allowed to present written or oral testimony. Once you are done, please remain in the room for questions or additional testimony as may be desired by the members of the Committee.

Questions and testimony shall be confined to the nature of the agenda. The current agenda is the Appointment of Rosie R. Tainatongo, to serve as a Member of the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Board of Directors. The Chair will invite individuals who have signed up to testify. Before speaking, individuals testifying shall first be recognized by the Chair and shall state their name for record purposes.

Personal inference about the character or motive of any Senator or any individual testifying is not permitted. Any violations of this general rule of conduct will result in removal from the Public Hearing Room for this proceeding. Individuals who fail to maintain proper form/decorum may be restricted from providing oral testimony and may be asked to leave or be escorted and removed from the room. Proper form/decorum shall be practiced by all present in the Public Hearing Room.

The A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam, was created by P.L. 13-57 as an autonomous agency of the Government of Guam to own, maintain, operate, and develop airport facilities and properties. GIAA took over operations from the Department of Commerce in 1976 and since then has been the island's only commercial airport supporting domestic and international air services for passengers and cargo.

GIAA, led by its Board of Directors and Management, strives to ensure the safety and security of the traveling public, is dedicated to maintaining a superior and reliable level of airport services for our island residents and tourists, and is committed to supporting the development of air linkages and facilities which are integral parts of the island's current and future economic growth.

At this time I'd like to call upon those who have signed in to testify. Please join us at the table and then we will proceed with any testimonies for members being nominated to the Board of Directors and then followed by the nominees themselves. All right, we will start with our Executive Manager, Senator Quinata, you are recognized.

John Quinata, Executive Manager, A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam:

Thank you madam chair. Honorable Amanda Shelton, Legislative Secretary and Chairwoman of the Committee on Air Transportation, Parks, Tourism, Higher Education, and Advancement of Women, Youth, and Senior Citizens of the 37th Guam Legislature. Vice Chair, Senator Jesse Anderson Lujan, thank you sir for being here. I am John M. Quinata, the Executive Manager for the Guam International Airport Authority and I'm here to provide testimony in support of the reappointment of Director Rosie R. Tainatongo, Director

Lucy M. Alcorn, and our Chairman Brian J. Bamba to the Board of Directors of the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority Guam.

Thank you and hopefully I can sit and stay around for any questions that you may have.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Thank you very much Senator Quinata. Is there anyone else who wishes to give testimony for the nominees? Please join us at the table. Can you state your name for the record and then begin?

Sophia Lujan:

Good afternoon Senator Shelton and Senator Jesse Lujan. My name is Sophia Lujan and I'm here to read a testimony on behalf of my aunt Mrs. Jeanette Yamashita who was not able to make it here today.

That's one okay and this one is my testimony.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Thank you very much for your testimony. Is there anyone who wishes to give testimony for the three Board of Directors for the airport? Okay I'd like to state for the record that we have a full house here today. Other members of the Board of Directors from the airport who are here in support as well as the administration and many staff members from the airport as well. Okay, we'll begin with Mr. Brian Bamba, our current Chairman of the Board of Directors, if you will.

Chairman Brian Bamba, Guam International Airport Authority Board of Directors:

Madam chair I also wanted to submit testimony in support of the directors.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Please proceed.

Chairman Brian Bamba, Guam International Airport Authority Board of Directors:

Good afternoon Senator Shelton and Senator Lujan. I'd like to say thank you for this opportunity to come before this body in my capacity as Chairman of the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority Guam, Board of Directors to present testimony in support of my fellow colleagues and valued members of our GIAA Airport Board Team - Directors Rosie Tainatongo and Lucy M. Alcorn.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Si Yu'os Ma'ase. Thank you very much. Mrs. Alcorn.

Chairman Brian Bamba, Guam International Airport Authority Board of Directors:

Actually, I was going to provide my own testimony, but out of respect, most importantly, and courtesy to these women I defer to let them go first.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Okay. Oh, okay, you have another testimony? Go ahead.

Chairman Brian Bamba, Guam International Airport Authority Board of Directors:

Well for myself, but they insist that I go first. I'm trying to be very respectful of my elders, but they prefer that I go first.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Okay, yes, please proceed.

Chairman Brian Bamba, Guam International Airport Authority Board of Directors:

I will. Good afternoon, Senators. Senator Shelton, Madam chair, and Vice Chair Senator Lujan.

And I'd also like to thank all of the airport employees and staff that are here in support. They've been a very, very instrumental and critical part of our operation. And so I thank them very much for their support and it happens today is my daughter's birthday and she's probably watching this online so Emmani, Happy Birthday. I love you. Thank you.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Thank you very much, Mr. Chair. Happy birthday to Emani and Mrs. Alcorn.

Lucy M. Alcorn:

Thank you very much for your testimony. Ms. Tainatongo.

Rosie R. Tainatongo:

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Si yu'os ma'ase and thank you to all our board members. I'd like to recognize Senator Will Parkinson, another member of our committee. And Senator, do you have any questions for the panel?

Senator William A. Parkinson:

Nope, no I'm just happy to hear the testimony and thank you for your service everyone.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Thank you very much and my Vice Chair and your future Chair of the airport as it's been announced Senator Lujan.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

Thank you Madam Chair. Before I ask a couple questions, I just want to say that it's been a great two years. And I want to recognize again of course, this is going to be the last time that we're going to be sitting here as the Vice Chair for Aviation under the leadership of course of my boss, Legislative Secretary Amanda Shelton. It's going to be the last time we are sitting here together as the 37th Guam Legislature. She's been a very gracious, friendly and fair Chair for the Committees that I sit in. I thank you for allowing me to be your Vice Chair as well and these committees. We're going to miss her and I'm sure we will be contacting her again for help in moving forward in the 38th Guam Legislature. So can we give her a hand please.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Thank you.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

Thank you great chairman and thank you very much. The committee composition will be a little different this time. I will still have, of course, Aviation. I will have all of the Airport, Aviation, Customs, airport police, and ARF. I would also have Port, Port operations, as well. Customs and Quarantine, Tourism, Federal and Foreign Affairs and all Utilities. So I'm going to definitely need both my chair's help. And of course the chair also of utilities right now so I'm glad that we sit in the same committee right now. But thank you again Madam Chair Shelton and also Senator Will Parkinson for again allowing me to sit in your committees on the 37th. Thank you very much, thank you.

Okay now back to business. Just one question. Going into the 38th Guam Legislature, it's very very important that we know again you know the situation that we're in. We have a great challenge in tourism. We know that the ports of entry are great assets to economic prosperity. I wanted to ask each and every one of you , what is the biggest impediment that you see in you setting the board and the airport? The biggest impediment you see that will keep us from moving forward in enticing businesses to come to Guam? The impediments that you see that will stifle our growth. And what you see in the properties and things that you have at the airport at this point.

Chairman Brian Bamba, Guam International Airport Authority Board of Directors:

I'm going to defer to my respectful colleagues. Thank you for the question Senator Lujan. But before I answer I also would like to extend my appreciation on behalf of the Board of Directors of the Airport Authority and all the employees. Senator Shelton, thank you for all your support and it's been a wonderful pleasure to have been working with you.

So what we see, I mean, there are many different issues that like I said in my testimony that while there are a lot of challenges, I do see these as opportunities. But I think the biggest one we have standing in front of us is what kind of inhibits investment right? And if we want to create economic activity and utilizing an airport which is really like a you know it's a conduit to Economic Development right? And whether it be tourism or other aspects of industry you know we stand like one third of a tourism component. And I don't say that everybody has a rap. I don't think GVB, the airport, or GEDA has any sole responsibility for it, but I think that you know collectively we all create this product called tourism right? And the airport's role in that is really to provide safe operations so that aircraft can bring passengers safely into our island, but on top of that, airports themselves are economic drivers and I think if we were to have some way to have instruments of contract and and lease ability to entice investors of large significant investments right? When you build something at the airport, you're not building, you know, something that's five or ten thousand dollars. You're usually seeing something that's a hanger, of a hundred million dollars or infrastructure that has heavily capital intents. And today we have limits on those you know. And so while we're working through that with the current legislature and administration, I think that's something that we would hope will continue and see some progress.

You know we look around at other airports in the world and we're kind of the exception. And that many places have maintenance facilities that attract airlines, you have logistics infrastructure that attracts companies such as Amazon and eBay and the whole night and that creates jobs right? And so giving us some flexibility to entertain and enter into some of these you know longer term leases would allow us to see what industries we can develop and then you know tourism I think is one one piece but it's how can we develop airport properties so that we have other legs of an economy to stand on. And

I think you know that's probably where we would see the biggest impediment.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

That being said, with the extension and looking at probably longer term, say leases, and all that, can you say that if that should happen that you can see Guam becoming a maybe a cargo hub?

John Quinata, Executive Manager, A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam:

Senator, thank you. You know I just came back from the three country tour that we did with the Governor, GVB and GIAA. And one of the big questions that they have from the airlines is of course bringing in more passengers. But one of the biggest questions is how can they bring more cargo in? And they want to invest in cargo facilities here in Guam, but the biggest impediment is the five year minimum lease or maximum lease, I'm sorry. So if they were to lift that and they to go at least 30 years, it will entice them to come in and expand their cargo facilities or cargo facilities for their airlines. So that's one of the biggest impediments. Matter of fact, in one of countries, which is Korea, Shinhan, which is the biggest credit card company in Korea, they already want to come into the airport and invest in a lounge kind of like the United Lounge but this one is for a club lounge for Shinhan card holders. And so they came in and the biggest question they have again is if it's only going to be five years, it's a showstopper for us. Because we cannot invest in constructing that facility and be expecting to get that money back in five years. There's just no way it's going to happen and they're not willing to go beyond ... if you're trying to go beyond five years and of course you're going to open up your financials they're not willing to do that if they're not guaranteeing the amount of years that they're supposed to get.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

Well, hopefully as we move forward, we can actually do even pre-clearance here. The island. As a matter of fact, I'm sure you all heard the news, yes Congressman Moylan called me really early this morning, that they did receive from TSA clearance that our folks here in Guam that travel from here

to Hawaii or beyond Hawaii, that they will no longer lug their bags. That they will go back to the old system. So that's good news.

John Quinata, Executive Manager, A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam:

That's an awesome step, Senator. And we've been working on that. And that's the first step right? Ultimately our goal is that they don't have to go through customs anymore. That when they arrive in Honolulu that they'll just be able to go to the gate, but this is the first step. This is just a baby step. So we did have um folks go through the system this morning, and so what we're used to is right when you get out of customs on to the left there's you have your bag check. But the way that system is right now is they exit out of customs and right when you exit out to the left is your bag drop. So much more easier than what it's been before.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

You know almost on a daily basis I'm sure our offices have got videos or even live FaceTime calls from folks that are going through the situation there but thank you again. You know we've been working on this for almost two years now and again really early this morning Congressman Moylan had called me and said we got the go ahead that it's no longer going to be that way. It's going to revert back to the similar situation.

John Quinata, Executive Manager, A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Guam:

So we're still working on the pre-clearance clearance for baggage. We got it for passengers. Now we need to work it for baggage so where we can be treated as a domestic flight.

Lucy M. Alcorn:

Madam Chair, Senator Lujan, and Senator Parkinson, I have to agree that would be the biggest impediment. I think we've been facing this for quite a while now. Our lease, the term of the lease at 5 years, it's very hard to entice businesses to come and actually have a place well create, I mean start a business here. And their ROI, it just wouldn't be worth it for them. So I have to agree. I think that if we in some way can increase the lease term to a longer

period of time, I really believe that we can entice lot of businesses to come to Guam and of course we continue to work closely with GVB as far as passengers and trying to recover from COVID and Mawar.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

Sure, you know, likewise it's not just developing properties outside you know airport property but even within the airport. You know businesses want to come inside. It's not you know as Chairman Brian has said it's not just \$10,000 that you're going to put in you know. It's probably you know quarter million, even a million dollars even to start the business at the airport and for five years that's I mean you have to fall in your head a few times to be able to say yes to that you know. But if you don't have a choice, that's what you do but you know. Times have changed and we're greatly challenged and we're looking for other industries to start here in Guam and if we can help out not only of course the tourism industry but create jobs and have more and have our folks who have left to come back to higher paying jobs and great skilled jobs and we can have that in our ports of entry. I think our ports of entry are major areas of economic prosperity for our island. Miss Rosie.

Rosie R. Tainatongo:

Well we do support the Senators and I hope that the new Senators that are coming in would support and make the lease agreement more than 5 years. And you know any business would want to come and build but they would want to try and make sure that they make money and if it's only five years I don't think that they would have enough to recover. So we are in support of that. We do want to, well our two managers, the Executive Manager and the Deputy Executive Manager, are trying our best to try and get more planes coming to Guam. Because we know how traveling is vital. Thank you.

Vice Chairman Jesse A. Lujan:

Well I mean going with how our President makes decisions, I hope our Republicans will make business decisions as well. Thank you. I'm good. I'm all in support, of course the reappointment and of course the nominations and our vote for their confirmation, so I'm all in favor, yes.

Chairwoman Amanda L. Shelton:

Absolutely, thank you very much, Mr. Chair and thank you to all of our nominees who have provided testimony today and to the airport Board and team who are also here. And your family and friends who are here in support. It has been an honor to work with all of you very closely over the last several years. You've been here in the public hearing room many times advocating for the airport and our recovery and so I would like to say si yu'os ma'ase for all of your hard work. And of course the three of you have my support as well. I've seen your commitment firsthand over and over again. And so I look forward to moving your nominations in this last hearing, I mean this last session in December and seeing you confirmed by our body. Si yu'os ma'ase everyone, thank you, Happy Thanksgiving to you and your families. Thank you. We will take a brief recess before the next hearing.

III. FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The Committee on Maritime & Air Transportation, Parks, Tourism, Higher Education, and the Advancement of Women, Youth, and Senior Citizens hereby reports on the appointment of Lucy M. Alcorn to serve as a Member of the A.B. Won Pat International Airport Authority, Board of Directors, with the recommendation of TO DO CONFIRM.
