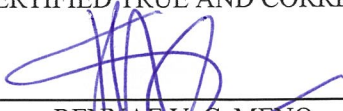

**AN ACT TO ADOPT RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR
GAMES OF CHANCE PURSUANT TO PUBLIC LAW 35-4.**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:**

2 **Section1. Adoption.**

3 *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* hereby adopts the Rules and Regulations, as amended and
4 attached, as Exhibit A entitled “Rules and Regulations for Games of Chance
5 Pursuant to Public Law 35-4.”

"Exhibit A"

*Rules & Regulations for Games of Chance
Pursuant to Public Law 35-4*

1 **DEFINITIONS**

2 **1.1 GAMES OF CHANCE**

3 Games of chance are limited to the following and will be clearly defined in the bid
4 packets provided to the vendors:

- 5 a) Beto Beto
- 6 b) Color Game
- 7 c) Big & Small
- 8 d) Poker, to include, but not be limited to, Texas Hold'em
- 9 e) Pusoy
- 10 f) Baccarat
- 11 g) Blackjack
- 12 h) Monte
- 13 i) Bingo

14 **1.2 GAMES REQUIRING SKILL**

15 A carnival game played for entertainment in which:

- 16 a) The contestant actively participates;
- 17 b) The outcome depends in a material degree upon the skill of the
18 contestant;
- 19 c) Only merchandise prizes are awarded.

20 **1.3 HOUSE OF CARDS**

21 A restricted, enclosed area where operation of the following games are limited:
22 Poker, including but not limited to Texas Hold'em, *Pusoy*, Baccarat, Blackjack,
23 and Monte.

1 **2. PROTOCOL FOR AUTHORIZATION, PROCUREMENT OF VENDORS, PROJECTED**
2 **REVENUES, SECURITY PROTOCOL, AND MAINTENANCE PLAN.**

3 Authorization for games of chance shall be pursuant to these rules and regulations
4 and upon the issuance of a proclamation by *I Maga'hågan Guåhan*.

5 **2.1 PROCUREMENT OF VENDORS**

6 Vendors shall be selected through a sealed-bid process with the successful bidders
7 being the highest bidders for each activity. For activities that allow for more than
8 one vendor, the bidders will be ranked in descending order and will be awarded in
9 that order. No vendor may submit a bid whom does not participate in a pre-bid
10 conference. All prospective bidders must include a police and court clearance.

11 **2.2 NUMBER OF VENDORS; LIMITED**

12 The number of allowable vendors for each type of Game of Chance and Games
13 Requiring Skill are listed below:

14 House of Cards - two (2)

15 Beto Beto - two (2)

16 Color Game - four (4)

17 Big & Small - two (2)

18 Games requiring skill - fifty (50)

19 **2.3 VENDOR; MINIMUM BID**

20 House of Cards Minimum Bid- \$250,000 each

21 Beto Beto Minimum Bid - \$5,000 each

1 Color Game Minimum Bid - \$7,500 each

2 Big & Small Minimum Bid - \$20,000 each

3 Games Requiring Skill Minimum Bid - \$150 - \$1,000 each depending on the
4 type of game proposed as will be further specified in the bid packet. If
5 minimum bid is not met, the Carnival Committee may consider a lower
6 minimum bid and do a rebid process.

7 **2.4 PROJECTED REVENUE**

8 The projected revenue is dependent upon the number of vendors that actually
9 participate. A preliminary forecast assumes that each of the available number of
10 slots is awarded at the minimum bid level for the Games of Chance only which
11 would yield \$580,000.00 It is further assumed that all fifty slots for games of skill
12 will be awarded at a minimum bid level of \$150 that will yield an additional
13 \$7,500.00 The total projected revenue based on these assumptions would be
14 \$587,500.00.

15 **2.5 SECURITY PROTOCOL**

16 In order to ensure that no minors will be allowed to partake in the Games of
17 Chance and to minimize the exposure of minors to these games, each vendor will
18 be required to verify the age of each participant. Any government issued
19 identification (foreign or domestic) shall be sufficient for age verification.
20 Further, the House of Cards will be a completely enclosed area and access will be
21 limited as further described in section 5.8.1 below. Uniformed security personnel
22 will be on the grounds at all times. Additionally, plain-clothed security personnel
23 may be present in any House of Cards.

2.6 MAINTENANCE PLAN

The Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival will implement a zero waste policy. Sorting stations will be placed throughout the grounds so that items can be separated for recycling and proper disposal. Food waste will be provided to local pig farmers for their use. All trash will be disposed of daily. All vendors are required to pay a refundable cleaning deposits to ensure proper clean up and removal of booths and associated structures within 15 days of the last day of operations. The refundable cleaning deposit fees are: \$5000 for House of Cards; \$2500 for Big & Small, Color Game, Beto-Beto; \$500 for Food, Confectionaries, Drinks, Amusement Rides, Live Animal Displays; \$200 for Games of Skill; \$100 Miscellaneous. Fees will only be refunded after an inspection is done by the Carnival Committee and accepts the area as being returned to its pre-carnival condition. Any expenses that must be incurred by the Carnival Committee to return the vendor's assigned area to pre-carnival condition will be deducted from the refundable clean up fee. If costs incurred to return the area to pre-carnival condition, then no refund will be made and vendor will be billed and obligated to pay additional costs. The following services may be contracted out: portable restroom rental with daily cleaning services, grass cutting, ground maintenance, and solid waste removal.

3. LICENSING

3.1 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- a) Every qualified individual or organization that has been awarded an opportunity to operate games of chance or games of skill at the 2019 Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival must obtain a business license for operation from the Department of Revenue and Taxation.

1 b) A business license issued by the Department of Revenue and Taxation shall
2 only be valid during the period of operation for the 2019 Guam Island Fair
3 and Liberation Day Carnival.

4 c) Licensees are only authorized to operate upon official 2019 Guam Island
5 Fair and Liberation Day Carnival grounds.

6 **3.2 REGISTRATION FORM**

7 Registration for a business license shall be upon a form supplied by the
8 Department of Revenue and Taxation.

9 **4. APPLICATIONS**

10 **4.1 APPLICATION FOR BUSINESS LICENSE; FEES**

11 a) Each individual or organization requesting a business license to operate at
12 the Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival shall complete an
13 application provided by the Department of Revenue and Taxation and
14 provide proof of eligibility for issuance of said license and pay any fees
15 associated with such license. Such proof shall include the following:

- 16 1. The by-laws and constitution or any other written authority under
17 with the applicant organization operates;
- 18 2. The names and addresses of a minimum of five individuals over the
19 age of 18 who are to be primarily responsible for the conduct of the
20 games of chance on each occasion; and
- 21 3. If incorporated, a copy of the applicant organization's articles of
22 incorporation

23 b) The Department of Revenue and Taxation, when provided all information
24 required by this section and upon its considered review of such qualifying

1 information and being satisfied that the applicant is qualified shall issue a
2 business license.

3 **4.2 APPROVAL**

4 No business license shall entitle any organization to hold, operate or
5 conduct, or assist in holding, operating or conducting of, any game or games of
6 chance outside of the official times and locations of operation for the 2019 Guam
7 Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival.

8 **5. GENERAL CONDUCT OF GAMES OF CHANCE**

9 **5.1 PARTICIPANT; RESTRICTION MINIMUM AGE**

10 No licensee shall permit any person under the age of 18 years to participate in
11 any games of chance located inside of the House of Cards. In order to enter
12 the house of cards, licensees shall ensure that all patrons are at least 21 years
13 or older.

14 **5.2 MEMBER IN CHARGE OF CONDUCT OF GAMES**

- 15 a) The officers of a licensee shall designate a bona fide, active member to be in
16 charge of, and primarily responsible for, the conduct of the game of chance
17 on each occasion
- 18 b) The member in charge shall supervise all activities on the occasions for
19 which he or she is in charge and shall be responsible for making the required
20 report of operations thereof.
- 21 c) The member in charge shall be familiar with the provisions of all relevant
22 laws, rules, and regulations.

1 D) All members designated in charge of conduct of games shall submit a police
2 and court clearance.

3 **5.3 OPERATION; RULES**

4 All Games of Chance shall be fully defined and described in bid packets.

5 **5.4 OPERATION; TIMES**

6 a) ~~Any Games of Chance shall maintain the same hours of operation as the~~
7 ~~Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival; except that Games of~~
8 ~~Chance may operate until~~ operate on Monday to Thursday from 4pm – 12
9 am, on Fridays from 4:00 p.m - 2:00 a.m., Saturdays 12:00 p.m- 2:00 am,
10 and Sundays from 12:00 p.m.- 12:00 a.m., and any Saturday hours shall be
11 in effect for any night prior to, or on an official federal or Guam holiday
12 during the time period authorized.

13 b) Games of Chance *shall begin no earlier than* the opening day of the Guam
14 Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival, and *shall* cease operations *no later*
15 *than* sixty (60) calendar days from the date of the opening day.

16 **5.5 OPERATION; LOCATION**

17 Any Games of Chance shall only operate on official grounds of the Guam
18 Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival as specified by the official proclamation
19 of the Governor of Guam authorizing the games of chance at the Liberation Day
20 Carnival and Guam Island Fair.

21 **5.6 COMPLIANCE**

22 **5.6.1 Compliance Officers; Access to Games of Chance**

1 The Department of Revenue and Taxation shall have two Compliance
2 Officers present on the grounds at all times of operation. Compliance Officers shall
3 have unfettered access to all areas of operations of Games of Chance.

4 **5.6.2 Cash Control Sheets and Reporting Forms**

5 Each individual Game of Chance Booth shall utilize the Cash Control Report
6 Sheets in the form depicted in Attachments “A” and “B” to these Rules that are
7 fully incorporated herein by this reference as if fully set forth here.

8 **5.7 CONDUCT OF TRADITIONAL BINGO**

9 **5.7.1 Bingo; Prohibition of Electronic Minding Devices and Card Minding** 10 **Devices**

11 No licensee shall permit the use of electronic minding devices or card minding
12 devices while operating bingo.

13 **5.7.2 Operation;**

- 14 a) All bingo games shall be played on non-reusable cards that are to be
15 indelibly marked when played.
- 16 b) The equipment used in the playing of bingo and the method of play shall be
17 such that each card shall have an equal opportunity to be a winner.

18 **5.7.3 Electronic Devices Not Permitted**

19 No Other Electronic games or Devices unauthorized in Guam Law are authorized
20 for use in any Games of Chance.

1 **5.8 CONDUCT OF HOUSE OF CARDS**

2 **5.8.1 Participant; Restriction Minimum Age**

3 No licensee shall permit any person under the age of 18 21 years to enter or
4 participate in any games of chance within the House of Cards.

5 **5.8.2 Prohibition of Currency Other Than Official Chips**

6 No licensee shall permit the use of any currency to be used during the conduct of
7 games other than official chips. Official chips shall be purchased within the House
8 of Cards for use during game play. Official chips may only be purchased and
9 redeemed at a centralized location within the House of Cards.

10 **6. MANAGEMENT OF GAMES OF CHANCE BY MAYORS' COUNCIL OF GUAM,**
11 **TIMELINES**

12 The Mayors' Council of Guam will have representation present at all times the
13 Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival is in operation. Said representative
14 will monitor the conduct of all Games of Chance wherever located on the carnival
15 grounds either in stand alone booths or within a House of Cards. Representatives
16 will ensure that all vendors are appropriately licensed and are providing the
17 required reports to the Department of Revenue and Taxation Compliance Officers
18 ~~in a timely manner~~ on a daily basis.

19 **7. REPORT OF OPERATIONS**

20 **7.1 FORM; TIME**

- 21 1. The report of operation shall be on the form provided by the Department of
22 Revenue and Taxation. The report shall contain the following information:
23 a. Gross receipts derived from each day of operation; and

1 b. A list of prizes offered or given and their respective values, if
2 applicable

3 2. The licensee shall file one copy of the report to the Compliance Officer at
4 the close of each day of operation.

5 **7.2 SUPPLY OF FORMS**

6 Forms for the Report of Operations shall be supplied by the Department of
7 Revenue and Taxation or the Compliance Officer upon request by a licensee.

8 **7.3 REPORT; NO GAME HELD**

9 When a game is not held on any date when a license, authorizes it to be held,
10 a report to that effect shall nonetheless be filed with the Compliance Officer with
11 the report for the next day of operation.

12 **7.4 DEFAULT**

13 If a licensee fails to file a report within the time required, or if a report is not
14 properly verified, or not fully, accurately and truthfully completed, licensed
15 operations shall be suspended until such time as the default has been corrected. If
16 there is a subsequent suspension, the license shall be revoked for the remainder of
17 the Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival and no fees shall be reimbursed.
18 Additionally, vendor shall be prohibited from participating in future bids for the
19 next 5 years.

20 **7.5 FINAL REPORTS**

21 **7.5.1 Report By Department of Revenue and Taxation**

22 ~~At~~ Within 60 days of the conclusion of the Liberation Day Festival Activities, the
23 Department of Revenue and Taxation shall submit to the Governor and the Office

1 of Public Accountability a report containing the following information as to the
2 operation of all games of chance occurring at the Festival:

- 3 1. The number of licenses issued,
- 4 2. The names and addresses of each licensee,
- 5 3. The aggregate amount of license fees collected;
- 6 4. The name and address of all persons detected in violation of the laws or
7 regulations; and
- 8 5. The total amount of Business Privilege Taxes and other taxes collected.

9 **7.5.2 Audit of the Mayors' Council of Guam**

10 The Mayors' Council of Guam shall be subject to an audit by the Office of Public
11 Accountability (OPA) within thirty (30) days of completion of the Guam Island
12 Fair and Liberation Day Carnival. All financial documents that are required for
13 this audit shall be submitted by the Mayors' Council of Guam to the OPA. The
14 OPA shall publish the audit and submit its report to the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan*
15 *Guåhan*.

16 **8. DETERMINATION OF PROCEEDS**

17 The proceeds from the Games of Chance are used to fund the events related to
18 Liberation Day including but not limited to memorial events hosted throughout the
19 months of July and August, the Liberation Parade, fireworks displays and other
20 events traditionally associated with the Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day
21 Carnival as well as attendant operational costs. The net proceeds of the Games of
22 Chance will be distributed in the following manner:

1 ~~in accordance with 1 GCA §1013, specifically, the proceeds will be split equally~~
2 ~~between the Mayors' Council of Guam and a charity or worthy public cause~~
3 ~~chosen by the First Gentleman.~~

4 ~~The fifty percent (50%)~~ Forty five percent (45%) of the proceeds that are shall be
5 allocated to the Mayors' Council of Guam, and is shall be deposited into the
6 Mayors' Council of Guam Revolving Fund to be used on projects that are voted on
7 by the Mayors as a whole. This fund is subject to audit by the OPA.

8 Forty five percent (45%) of the proceeds shall be allocated to the First Gentleman's
9 choice of a worthy public cause.

10 It has been determined that the Department of Revenue and Taxation needs
11 additional funding to meet compliance mandates set forth by Public Law 35-4 and
12 the Rules and Regulations promulgated. Therefore, 10% of net proceeds shall go
13 toward the Department of Revenue and Taxation in a separate account set up to
14 offset operational costs for this mandate.

“The proceeds from the Games of Chance are used to fund the events related to Liberation Day including but not limited to memorial events hosted throughout the months of July and August, the Liberation Parade, fireworks displays and other events traditionally associated with the Guam Island Fair and Liberation Day Carnival as well as attendant operational costs, and the costs incurred by the Department of Revenue and Taxation in fulfilling the compliance mandates set forth by Public Law 35-4, to include but not limited to staffing, equipment, and overtime.

The net proceeds of the Games of Chance will be distributed ~~in the following manner:~~ in accordance with 1 GCA §1013, specifically, the proceeds will be split equally between the Mayors' Council of Guam and a charity or worthy public cause chosen by the First Gentleman. The fifty percent (50%) ~~Forty five percent (45%)~~ of the proceeds ~~that are shall be~~ allocated to the Mayors' Council of Guam; ~~and is shall be~~ deposited into the Mayors' Council of Guam Revolving Fund to be used on projects that are voted on by the Mayors as a whole. This fund is subject to audit by the OPA. The remaining fifty percent (50%) ~~Forty five percent (45%)~~ of the proceeds shall be allocated to the First Gentleman's choice of a worthy public cause.

~~It has been determined that the Department of Revenue and Taxation needs additional funding to meet compliance mandates set forth by Public Law 35-4 and the Rules and Regulations promulgated. Therefore, 10% of net proceeds shall go toward the Department of Revenue and Taxation in a separate account set up to offset operational costs for this mandate.”~~
