**AN ACT TO *AMEND* § 8104(p) OF ARTICLE 1, CHAPTER
8, TITLE 4, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO
INCLUDING DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH AFFAIRS
YOUTH SERVICE WORKERS AS UNIFORMED
PERSONNEL FOR RETIREMENT PURPOSES.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* finds
that Guam’s uniformed personnel are afforded the opportunity to retire from
government service five (5) years earlier, based on age, than the typical public
employee.

It is, therefore, the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to afford the same
retirement opportunity to the Department of Youth Affairs Youth Service Workers

1 by including them as uniformed personnel for retirement purposes and thus maintain
2 the integrity of the law enforcement community.

3 **Section 2.** § 8104(p) of Article 1, Chapter 8, Title 4, Guam Code Annotated,
4 is hereby *amended* to read:

5 “(p) Uniformed Personnel means Guam Police Department Officers;
6 Guam Fire Department Firemen; Customs and Quarantine Officers of the
7 Customs and Quarantine Agency; Conservation Officers, Commodity
8 Inspectors, and Entomologists of the Department of Agriculture; Territorial
9 Park Patrol Officers of the Department of Parks and Recreation; Corrections
10 Officers of the Department of Corrections; Airport Police Officers and
11 Security Personnel at the Antonio B. Won Pat International Airport Authority,
12 Guam; Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port Security Personnel; Marshals
13 of the Supreme Court of Guam and the Superior Court of Guam; Probation
14 Officers of the Judiciary of Guam; Firefighters of the Antonio B. Won Pat
15 International Airport Authority, Guam; and Youth Service Workers of the
16 Department of Youth Affairs engaged in juvenile detention and rehabilitation.
17 In all matters involving the uniformed personnel at the Antonio B. Won Pat
18 International Airport Authority, Guam, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero
19 Commercial Port, or the Department of Parks and Recreation, the Supreme
20 Court of Guam and the Superior Court of Guam Marshals, and the Guam
21 Police Department shall have concurrent jurisdiction with such personnel.”

22 **Section 3. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.
