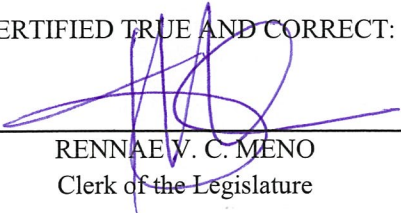

**AN ACT TO ADD A NEW ARTICLE 5 TO CHAPTER 51
OF DIVISION 2, TITLE 10, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED,
RELATIVE TO CREATING A TASK FORCE TO
GATHER INFORMATION AND CREATE GOALS FOR
POLICY CONCERNING USED OIL MANAGEMENT.**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. A new Article 5 is *added* to Chapter 51 of Division 2, Title 10,
Guam Code Annotated, to read:

“ARTICLE 5

THE *PRUTEHI I TANO'-TA* ACT

§ 51501. Title.

This Article *shall* be known and may be cited as “The *Prutehi I Tano'-ta* Act.”

§ 51502. Task Force Composition.

The Task Force *shall* be comprised of the following:

(a) the Administrator of the Guam Environmental Protection
Agency or his/her designee;

1 (b) the General Manager of the Guam Solid Waste Authority or
2 his/her designee;

3 (c) the General Manager of the Guam Power Authority or his/her
4 designee;

5 (d) the Speaker of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* or his/her designee;

6 (e) the legislative committee chairperson with jurisdiction on the
7 environment or his/her designee, who *shall* have the option of appointing a
8 member of the Legislature's environment committee to also serve as a
9 member of the Task Force;

10 (f) *I Maga'låhen/Maga'hågan Guåhan* or his/her designee;

11 (g) the Administrator of the Guam Economic Development
12 Authority or his/her designee;

13 (h) the legislative committee chairperson with jurisdiction on power
14 and energy utilities or his/her designee; and

15 (i) a member of the general public to be appointed by *I*
16 *Maga'låhen/Maga'hågan Guåhan*.

17 The legislative committee chairperson with jurisdiction on the environment
18 *shall* serve as Presiding Officer of the Task Force. The members of the Task Force
19 *shall* serve without compensation.

20 **§ 51503. Duties of the Task Force.**

21 The Task Force *shall* meet at the call of the Presiding Officer and make
22 recommendations for the management of used oil.

23 In making recommendations, the Task Force *shall*:

24 (a) gather information concerning any and all efforts related to the
25 management of used oil;

26 (b) receive reports and testimony from individuals, government of
27 Guam agencies, and any other public and private organizations;

1 (c) create goals and recommendations for local policy that address
2 the safe and proper management of used oil as defined in § 51102(hh)(11) of
3 Article 1 of this Chapter; and

4 (d) submit a report with its recommendations to *I*
5 *Maga'låhen/Maga'hågan Guåhan* and *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* by September
6 30, 2019. Any further recommendations *shall* be transmitted annually
7 thereafter.

8 **§ 51504. Task Force Recommendations.**

9 The Task Force recommendations may include proposals for specific changes
10 to the Guam Code Annotated and/or the Guam Administrative Rules and
11 Regulations, request(s) for technical assistance from the U.S. government,
12 interagency and/or public-private partnerships, and other actions necessary to protect
13 the environment through the safe and proper management of used oil.”

14 **Section 2. Effective Date.** This Act *shall* be effective upon enactment.

15 **Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any
16 person or circumstance is found to be invalid or contrary to law, such invalidity *shall*
17 *not* affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without
18 the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are
19 severable.
