

# DPHSS works to minimize the spread of dengue virus

There have been no new cases of dengue on island since officials reported a locally transmitted case on June 21.

Department of Public Health and Social Services officials, in an update to the public via press release, said they're continuing with surveillance and monitoring. The agency also has sprayed pesticides at homes, and at least one business and one school in areas considered breeding grounds for mosquitoes. More than 50 buildings have been sprayed thus far, officials stated.

While officials didn't say what areas they're focusing on specifically, the press release does note that DPHSS is working with the office of the Dededo mayor.

As part of Public Health's enhanced surveillance, adult and larval mosquitoes were collected from the area, and most were identified as *Aedes albopictus*, which is a known transmitter of dengue virus. These mosquitoes will be sent for pathogen testing to Public Health's nonprofit partners at

the Puerto Rico Vector Control Unit.

In late 2019 to early 2020, Guam had about 22 known cases of dengue fever, 13 of which were considered locally acquired. The other nine were cases where residents had come from other countries.

The Division of Environmental Health has collaborated with Pacific Island Health Officers Regional Entomologist Dr. Limb Hapairai, who

has provided guidance to the DEH response team.

"We are appreciative of the assistance Dr. Hapairai, and our partners in (the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity and Division of Vector-Borne Disease, have provided," stated Tom Nadeau, DEH chief environmental public health officer.

DPHSS Division of Environmental Health, on June 22, started canvassing approximately 124 homes and buildings and disseminating educational materials about eliminating mosquito breeding sites and bite prevention, and to identify and eliminate sources of water that could potentially breed mosquitoes.

Consent from residences and business owners was obtained for those who elected to have their outdoor premises sprayed with pesticides.

As of July 2, a total of 52 buildings, including 50 residences, one school, and one retail store, were sprayed. DEH staff have been applying U.S. Environmental Protection Agency-approved

pesticides in these areas, which target adult and larval mosquitoes.

Health screening of residents in the area of concern was conducted by DPHSS to identify individuals with dengue symptoms.

The Dededo Mayor's Office contributed to the response by helping to eliminate mosquito breeding sites by clearing tires, white goods and other sources of water where mosquitoes can lay their eggs. The mayor's office also urged residents within the areas of concern to remove any standing water and put screens on containers used to collect water for plants.

The dengue virus is transmitted to humans by the bite of an infected mosquito and cannot spread directly from person to person. Anyone who lives in, or travels to, an area where dengue virus is found can get it from mosquito bites. To prevent local transmission, DPHSS advises that the community should avoid mosquito bites and eliminate mosquito breeding sites. **(Daily Post Staff)**

# No injuries, damage in attack against U.S. forces in Syria

WASHINGTON (Reuters) - U.S. forces in eastern Syria took indirect fire on Saturday but initial reports did not indicate any casualties or damage, a U.S. defense official told Reuters.

The incident was the latest in a series of attacks on U.S. personnel in Iraq and Syria in recent days.

The official, speaking on the condition of anonymity, said the attack occurred in Conoco, Syria.

U.S. diplomats and troops in Iraq and Syria were targeted in three rocket and drone attacks on Wednesday alone, including at least 14 rockets hitting an Iraqi air base hosting U.S. forces, wounding two American service members.

While there have not been imme-

diated claims of responsibility for the attacks, analysts believed they were part of a campaign by Iranian-backed militias.

Iraqi militia groups aligned with Iran vowed to retaliate after U.S. strikes on the Iraqi-Syrian border killed four of their members last month.

Iran has denied supporting attacks on U.S. forces in Iraq and Syria and condemned U.S. air strikes on Iranian-backed groups.

The United States has been holding indirect talks with Iran aimed at bringing both nations back into compliance with the 2015 Iran nuclear deal, which was abandoned by the Trump administration. No date has been set for a next round of the talks, which adjourned on June 20.

## Japan government ready to deploy economic stimulus flexibly

TOKYO (Reuters) - Japan stands ready to pump more money into the economy to ease the pain of a prolonged pandemic, the top government spokesman said on Sunday, nodding to growing political calls for additional stimulus to prop up growth.

Less than two weeks before hosting the Olympics, Tokyo goes into its fourth COVID-19 state of emergency from Monday through Aug. 22, fueling fears of extended pain for restaurants hit by shorter hours and a ban on alcohol consumption.

"First of all we must proceed with anti-infection measures and vaccination in cooperation with the citizens, and provide support for businesses and people in need," Chief Cabinet Secretary Katsunobu Kato said in a debate program on public broadcaster NHK.

"Then we want to flexibly take economic measures without hesita-

tion," Kato said, without mentioning the size or timing of further stimulus measures.

Lawmakers from Prime Minister Yoshihide Suga's Liberal Democratic Party have escalated calls for a new relief package, with party heavyweight Toshihiro Nikai saying an extra budget of around 30 trillion yen (\$270 billion) is needed. read more

The world's third-largest economy is expected to rebound from its annualized 3.9% contraction in the first quarter, but analysts expect the recovery to be gradual, with service sector consumption a particular weak spot.

Government spending is constrained by public debt at 2.5 times Japan's annual economic output - the heaviest debt burden in the industrial world, inflated by massive stimulus packages rolled out over the past year.

Suga, who must call a general election later this year, said on Thursday the government wants to focus on such areas as corporate financing, employment and restaurants, and wants to deliver as early as possible.

# Australia reports first 2021 COVID-19 death, highest case number

MELBOURNE (Reuters) - Australia reported its first coronavirus-related death of the year on Sunday and a 2021 record 77 new cases of the virus in the state of New South Wales, which is battling an outbreak of the highly infectious Delta variant.

State Premier Gladys Berejiklian said the numbers in and around the country's biggest city Sydney, already under a hard lockdown, are expected to rise.

"I'll be shocked if it's less than 100 this time tomorrow, of additional new cases," Berejiklian told a televised briefing.

On Saturday there were 50 cases, the previous 2021 record high. The recent outbreak stands at 566 cases.

Of Sunday's cases, 33 were people who had spent time in the community while they were infectious, raising the likelihood that the three-week lockdown of more than 5 million people in Sydney and surroundings will be extended.

"Given where we're at and given the lockdown was supposed to be lifted on Friday, everybody can tell

it's highly unlikely at this stage," Berejiklian said.

There are 52 cases in hospital, or about one in 10 people infected in the current outbreak. Fifteen people are in intensive care, five require ventilation. The death, the country's first locally contracted case since December, involved a woman in her 90s.

Australia has fared much better than many other developed countries in keeping its COVID-19 numbers relatively low, seeing just over 31,000 cases since the start of the pandemic and 911 deaths.

The vaccination rollout, however, has been sluggish due to supply constraints and changing medical advice for its mainstay AstraZeneca shots.

Vaccinations are available for now only to people over 40 and groups at risk either due to their health or exposure to the virus at work. Of those hospitalized in Sydney, 11 are under the age of 35 and more than three-quarters of the patients have not had any doses, health authorities said.

Among the items on the agenda was the consideration of the appointment of Ms. Maria M. Dunn to serve as a Member (Sports Tourism - Representative) of the Guam Unarmed Combat Commission whose appointment history is as follows:

- Appointed by Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero on March 30, 2021, to serve for four (4) years from the Date of Confirmation
- Appointment packet forwarded to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* on April 7, 2021
- Appointment packet forwarded to this committee for public consideration on June 10, 2021

#### Public Notice Requirements

Virtual Public Hearing notices were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on July 7, 2021, and again on July 12, 2021, fulfilling the 5-Day Notice and 48 Hour Notice of the Open Government Law requirements respectively.

The confirmation hearing for **Ms. Maria M. Dunn** commenced at 9:01 a.m.

#### II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY AND DISCUSSION

**Chairperson Perez:** The rules of conduct for this virtual public hearing are as follows: the host of this hearing will mute all participants until called upon by the Chair; virtual backgrounds should not be utilized during the hearing; and participants face must be visible at all times. When you speak, please make sure to that you are unmuted and that you're speaking into the microphone. Senators will be allowed to pose questions to any of the nominees after testimony is given. Questions and testimony shall be confined to the substance and nature of the agenda.

We're going to move on to the nominations for the Guam Unarmed Combat Commission. To my knowledge this commission has not been fully empaneled since the law was created in 2009. Some of the responsibilities of this commission is to uphold the laws under 11 GCA, Chapter 7, and some of those responsibilities include adopting rules and regulations. Currently

the rules and regs that were created for the previous commission, which is the wrestling and boxing commission, are now null and void. One of the primary tasks that this commission would have to do is to create the rules and regulations for the administration of this, perhaps, new industry. Some of these rules and regulations includes qualification of ring officials, which are required at exhibitions or contests, procedures for court clearances, investigation of criminal history of all ring officials and employees of the commission, and any applicant of the commission wishes to investigate. It also has powers related to the compensation of ring officials, overseeing qualifications of licensees, creating rules for competition weighing of contestants, scoring decisions, age limits, weight limits, physical conditions, and classification of contestants. Some of the other responsibilities of the commission is that they shall review and approve all forms of contracts between sponsors, licensees, promoters, and contestants. They may appoint one or more official representatives to be designated as inspectors and may appoint one chief inspector. They have the authority to affiliate with any other state or national boxing commission or athletic authority. Another important duty is the issuing and revoking of licenses, as well as to deny or approve any applications of any license.

Now I would like to move on to the hearing for our first nominee. It's the executive appointment of Ms. Maria M. Dunn to serve as a Member (Sports Tourism—Representative), Guam Unarmed Combat Commission. We don't have anyone here to testify, I believe, on her behalf, but we did receive written testimony from... I'm sorry, my mistake. We do have somebody to testify. Ms. Camacho, you are recognized.

**Jennifer C. Camacho:** Thank you, Senator. I'm actually—what I'll do, since Maria's going first, my testimony is really for both of them, Maria and Joseph. I'll just go ahead and give my testimony, since Maria's up first.

**Chairperson Perez:** Please proceed.

**Mrs. Camacho:** *Håfa adai*, Honorable Senator Perez and Senators of the 36<sup>th</sup> Guam Legislature. My name is Jennifer Camacho, and I'm here to formally express my support for both Maria Dunn and Joey Crisostomo, Jr., to the Guam Unarmed Combat Commission. Their years of experience, more than two decades, combined, as athletes, and their vast knowledge of martial arts will contribute significantly to this Commission. In addition, their passion for the sport and industry will ensure this Commission operates with the utmost integrity, and I know they will do everything they can to protect the athletes while ensuring the laws and rules of this Commission are carried through. Sports on Guam have long had a positive impact on our community, and martial arts is one of the most popular sports due to its diversity in discipline, such as wrestling, jiu jitsu, kickboxing, you name it. It's refreshing to see young and passionate citizens in our community stepping up to serve on our government commission, and I believe there are no better nominees than Maria Dunn and Joey Crisostomo, Jr., to do this. Thank you.

**Chairperson Perez:** *Si Yu'os ma'åse'*, Mrs. Camacho. I believe, Darrin Bair sent written testimony in support of Maria Dunn, in his personal capacity. I believe there's no one else here to testify. In that case, I would like to invite the nominee to present her testimony. Ms. Dunn, you're welcome.

**Ms. Maria Dunn, Nominee:** Hello, good morning. Thank you very much for having me here. Good morning, Honorable Senator, Senator Perez, Senator Ada, Senator Ridgell, as well as all other participants present for today's public hearing. I am honored and grateful to Governor Leon Guerrero and Lieutenant Governor Tenorio for nominating me as a Board Member for the Guam Unarmed Combat Commission in the area of Sports Tourism. Thank you very much for those who have sent in testimonies, and who have testified on my behalf, today. I'd just like to share a little bit about my background, as an athlete. For the island of Guam, I have been a wrestler since 1998 about the age of 11, and I started competing nationally, or internationally for Guam at the age of 14 in the year 2000 to 2001. I was one of the pioneer female wrestlers for the island of Guam in the arena of high school wrestling. Now, there is currently a Women's League for wrestling in the high schools, whereas before, because of Title IX we were able to wrestle with the guys. And so, I consider that a major improvement in high school wrestling, especially on the front for women's equity in sport. I wrestled in college for two years and I became an "All-American", meaning that I placed a top two, nationally, in the states, in the sport of wrestling. I continued to wrestle for Guam internationally in over 10 Oceania Regional Championships, and I was also a two-time Olympian in the year 2008 and 2012 representing Guam in Beijing, and then later in London. I've had a pretty, pretty healthy career in wrestling. Throughout the time that I was wrestling, I also had experience and interest in the sports of boxing and Muay Thai, as well as Jiu jitsu. I practiced Jiu jitsu for maybe four to five years.

Currently, I coach wrestling at the high school level. I am deeply invested in the youth of Guam, youth wrestling, youth sports, youth exposure to these sports, especially in dispelling myths about unarmed combat sports being too dangerous for kids to practice, whereas, I believe they are very excellent in teaching discipline and skill. It's very important for mental strength, as well. At the moment, I am currently an official. I spent five or six years coaching at the high school level. I am the president of the non-profit Snakepit Wrestling Academy Guam, where we teach wrestling to kid's years five up to eighteen, and I am a head referee for GWA—Guam Wrestling Association, at the moment. Currently, I am an elementary school principal. Other than my being a former competitor and current official, I am hopeful that my 20-plus years of experience in this competitive arena will provide valuable input and insight into the future of sport of unarmed combats for on the island of Guam. It is my greatest hope that within the next four years, if I am to be elected and placed on this Board, that I can help in the development of this Commission to create a strong foundation. Like you have said, it's never been fully, like, culminated, and I would really like to be a part of that, to build the strong foundation for these sporting events, especially ones that are unbiased, that reflect the integrity and provide enrichment and growth to the athletes and the spectators who will take part in unarmed combat sports on Guam, not just Guam residents, but those who choose to travel to Guam for the sake of competing in unarmed combat on Guam. Thank you, so much, for this opportunity.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank you so much, Ms. Dunn. Yes, I think you have a very impressive background, and I think it's so important that with this industry that serve on this commission would have the best interest of the participants at heart, that you have so much commitment to wrestling and growing that, and being unbiased. I think that's very critical attributes to be

on this Commission, and the fact that you're willing to commit the time, considering that you are also a principal of an elementary school. That that is a lot of work, as it is, and that you're willing to grow this industry in a safe manner, I think that's so important. I guess a couple of things. What would you like to contribute should you be confirmed by the Legislature. What do you, what would you like to see accomplished within those four years?

**Ms. Dunn:** Ideally, to the best of our abilities, as a Board, if I am to be elected on this Board, is to hold true to the things that you said were necessary for this Commission, things that have not, the groundwork has not yet been laid, like, you know, like assigning a Chief Inspector, coming up with certain laws and certain rules, and then also, coming up with, I guess, procedures and protocols for the issuing or revoking of licenses, procedures, and protocols for events, themselves, for coming to decisions regarding the Medical Board, making sure that the foundation, at four years it seems long, but there's a lot that needs to be done and I feel that if we can—my biggest hope is to be able to really lay down a solid groundwork and structure for these rules and for these laws, for the health and safety of the spectators, for the structure of the organization, in regards to events and hosting events. That's something that, it sounds lofty but it's something that I would dedicate my time for.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank you so much, and I think being a woman athlete, I think you are definitely a role model, as well, to other girls out there that would like to potentially make this their profession, as well as, being a role model for being accountable, creating something that's strong foundationally. I think you provide a lot of opportunities for girls that are aspiring, and boys, aspiring to be in this industry. So, thank you for stepping up to the plate, accepting this nomination, and serving Guam in other capacities. So, thank you so much. At this time, I would like to open up the floor to my colleagues for any questions. Senator Tony Ada.

**Senator Ada:** Thank you, Madam Chair. I don't have any questions. Ms. Dunn, thank you for accepting the nomination from Governor Lou Leon Guerrero. I think, you know, this Commission that hasn't been active in many years, the challenges are going to be ahead of you guys, but just know that you're going to have the support of the, you know, all those around you, you know, we want to make sure that any board or commission that is brought to the forefront, and when you guys want to make a difference in how things are being done out there, and especially the regulatory side of it, coming up with the rules and regulations, we're here to support. So, anything that we can do to support you in making sure that the Board does become a very active and productive board, then we're here for you. But thank you for accepting the nomination. I look forward to voting on your confirmation. Thank you, Madam Chair. I appreciate the time and the opportunity.

**Chairperson Perez:** *Si Yu'os ma'åse'*, Senator Ada. Senator Ridgell.

**Senator Ridgell:** Yes, thank you, Madam Chair. No questions, just some comments. First of all, congratulations to Maria Dunn, on your nomination. I'm, for those who don't know, I'm kind of a big MMA nerd, I like to call myself. I'm really into mixed martial arts, and so I'm very well-aware of your career and well-aware of your accomplishments as a wrestler and the

stuff that you give back to the community, including the wrestling camps, I think you guys just had a summer camp recently, if I'm not mistaken, and I'm really happy with all that you've done for the community, and giving back to the kids and helping instill discipline in our youth. My main comment is that I really hope that you and the other Board Members who are being nominated, please, please, just hit the ground running. Let's get this thing going, let's get this thing off the ground. There is a hunger for MMA on Guam. We have some of the best talent in the world. We're joined right now, I can see online with us, Frank "The Crank" Camacho, our very own fighter in the *Ultimate Fighting Championship* (UFC), which is the premier fighting organization in the world. We have so many fighters from our small island who have been able to make it to these great heights, and I know we can achieve only greater if we can really get the MMA community together, get some MMA events going, again. You know, everyone's aware of the *Pacific Xtreme Combat*, PXC, was going for a long time. Unfortunately, we haven't had any real MMA events for a long time, and we need to get this going so we can get the next generation of Frank "The Crank" Camachos, and the next generation of Roman Dela Cruz. I also see him online, as well. Roman Dela Cruz is the founder of *Fökai*, which is one of Guam's first major brands on Guam, local brands on Guam, that is spread now, internationally. He's one of the founders of Jiu jitsu and MMA on Guam, and we've accomplished so much despite not even having a commission in place and not having an MMA event for so many years, now. Imagine what we can accomplish when we get everything together, get everyone together, and really solidify our place in the Mixed Martial Arts world. So, Mrs. Dunn and the other nominees, I encourage you, please hit the ground running. Think of the big picture, of our place in the world, and how we can really show Guam's talent, showcase Guam's talent in the MMA community. Thank you.

**Chairperson Perez:** Thank you, Senator Ridgell, and thank you so much, Ms. Dunn, for accepting the nomination. We do, I look forward to your confirmation and serving on this Board, and *Si Yu'os ma'åse'* for all that you have done. So, thank you very much, and have a great day.

Chairperson Perez then adjourned the confirmation hearing for **Ms. Maria M. Dunn** at 10:37 a.m.
