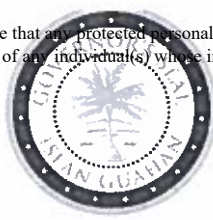

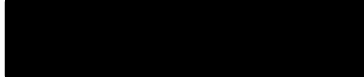

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NAVFAC Marianas: After artifacts collected, historic sites bulldozed

The military on Guam has confirmed historic sites found within infrastructure projects related to the relocation of Marines to the island have been leveled and more will be bulldozed to make way for facilities.

Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) Marianas, which supports local activities of the U.S. military, clarified for The Guam Daily Post language included in two programmatic agreement memos issued for public comment, which said historic properties identified in areas affected by construction “will no longer be extant” once mitigation work was completed.

“Significant discoveries” that were identified through another, ongoing construction project in the area were data recovered, along with site information documented, according to the command. The development is taking place in a site the military calls North Finegayan, but the location has also been called Machanao pre-World War II, according to the memos.

“Recovered associated artifacts and any other resources that could be curated were collected and are properly stored pending turnover to the government of Guam upon the completion of the future cultural repository,” said JoAnna Delfin, public affairs officer for NAVFAC Marianas.

“Although traces of the site are removed, the information and location are documented in technical reports for future studies about the area and its environment, which contributes to the knowledge of Guam’s history and the CHamoru people.”

Several residents, community organizations and lawmakers have advocated for any historic or cultural discoveries found during military construction projects to be preserved in place or for any artifacts or other archaeological findings not to be further disturbed. NAVFAC also confirmed the historic sites previously identified have already been developed.

“All recoverable features are no

longer in place as the site has been graded to bedrock,” Delfin said.

NAVFAC Marianas said once a discovery is made, its location is documented with “sub-meter accuracy.” Collection efforts can include hand excavation, screening soil, and collecting soil and carbon samples. This type of mitigation work leaves a historic property with its “integrity diminished” and characteristics “altered,” according to the memos.

But not everything discovered was collected before it was subsequently leveled.

“While curation is an important part of the process, not every piece of an artifact was collected if it was determined that a sample can provide the same type of information,” Delfin said. “Although traces of the site are removed, the information and location are documented in technical reports for future studies about the area and its environment, which contributes to the knowledge of Guam’s history and the CHamoru people.”

The public can comment on the memos until July 22. Both documents are available online, or residents can obtain a printed copy at the Department of Parks and Recreation office in Agana Heights. Community comments can be emailed to criwebcomment@navy.mil.

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Taiwan staff leave HK amid 'one China' row

TAIPEI (Reuters) - Taiwanese staff working at the island's representative office in Hong Kong will begin leaving the Chinese-run city from Sunday, a senior official said, after the government there demanded its officials sign a document supporting Beijing's claim to Taiwan.

Chinese-ruled Hong Kong has become another bone of contention between Taipei and Beijing, especially after Taiwan lambasted a security law imposed on Hong Kong by Beijing and began welcoming Hong Kongers to settle on the island.

Lin Fei-fan, deputy secretary general of Taiwan's ruling Democratic Progressive Party, said only local staff would remain at the office.

"This is because the Chinese Communist Party and the Hong Kong government continue to force our personnel stationed in Hong Kong to sign a 'one China commitment letter' to recognize 'one China,'" he said on his Facebook page.

"As a political prerequisite for the visa renewal, we will of course not accept it!"

China sees democratically-ruled Taiwan as part of "one China" and has never renounced the use of force to bring the island under its control.

Lin said Taiwan would never accept "one China" or "one country, two systems", Beijing's way of running Hong Kong under Chinese sovereignty it hopes to one day apply to the island.

A senior Taiwan official familiar with the matter told Reuters seven Taiwan officials will return on Sunday afternoon, with the last remaining official to come back after visa expiry next month.

"It is not acceptable for us to be

politically diminished," the official said, pointing to the request to sign the document.

In a statement earlier on Sunday, Taiwan's Mainland Affairs Council said that since July 2018 the Hong Kong government has "repeatedly set unreasonable political conditions for staff visas for our Hong Kong office, demanding the signing of a 'One China Commitment Letter'".

Starting from Monday, the Hong Kong office will "adjust its business handling method," it added, saying the office will maintain "necessary operations".

Taiwanese staff will not sign any such "one China" letter, it added.

Last month, Hong Kong suspended operations at its Taiwan representative office, blaming Taipei's "gross" interference in internal affairs, including with its offer to assist "violent" protesters, accusations Taiwan rejected.

Macau's government followed suit on Wednesday.

As Iran veers right, ties to Gulf Arab states hinge on nuke pact

DUBAI (Reuters) - Gulf Arab states are unlikely to be deterred from dialogue to improve ties with Iran after a hardline judge won the presidency but their talks with Tehran might become tougher, analysts said.

Prospects for better relations between Muslim Shi'ite Iran and Sunni Gulf Arab monarchies could ultimately hinge on progress to revive Tehran's 2015 nuclear accord with world powers, they said, after Ebrahim Raisi won Friday's election.

The Iranian judge and cleric, who is subject to U.S. sanctions, takes office in August, while nuclear talks in Vienna under outgoing President Hassan Rouhani, a more pragmatic cleric, are ongoing.

Saudi Arabia and Iran, longtime foes, began direct talks in April to contain tensions at the same time as global powers have been embroiled in nuclear negotiations.

"Iran has now sent a clear message that they are tilting to a more radical, more conservative position," said Abdulkhaleq Abdulla, a UAE political analyst, adding that Raisi's election might make improving Gulf ties a tougher challenge.

"Nevertheless, Iran is not in a position to become more radical ... because the region is becoming very difficult and very dangerous," he added.

The United Arab Emirates, whose commercial hub Dubai has been a trade gateway for Iran, and Oman, which has often played a regional

mediation role, were swift to congratulate Raisi.

Saudi Arabia and Bahrain are the only Gulf states yet to comment.

"The faces may change but the leader is (Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali) Khamenei," columnist Khaled al-Suleiman wrote in Saudi newspaper Okaz.

Raisi, an implacable critic of the West and an ally of Khamenei, who holds ultimate power in Iran, has voiced support for continuing the nuclear negotiations.

"If the Vienna talks succeed and there is a better situation with America, then (with) hardliners in power, who are close to the supreme leader, the situation may improve," said Abdulaziz Sager, chairman of Gulf Research Center.

To the Speaker Therese Terlaje and members of the 36th Guam legislature:

My name is Lisa Flores. I am a primary care physician working at both the SDA Guam Clinic and the Southern Regional Community Health Center. I have been appointed by Governor Lou Leon Guerrero to continue in serving in the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. My initial appointment was back in 2006 under the Camacho-Moylan Administration. At that time, the goal was to restart the commission which was in a dormant mode. The request was to have someone with a medical background who could take time out for his/her already busy schedule to be part of this team. Although I was confirmed by the 28th Guam Legislature, the commission never became a fully functioning entity during that time. I was then reappointed under the Camacho-Cruz administration, but was unable to fulfill the obligations due to scheduling issues. I was then asked to join the CICC under the Calvo-Tenorio administration and was confirmed to serve from 2012 to 2016 and again from 2016 to 2020.

During Leonardo Rapadas' term as Attorney General, attempts were made to get the CICC to start reviewing applications that had been sitting for years. However, it wasn't until Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson became the Attorney General in 2015, that the CICC was resurrected. Those that were serving at that time included Denise Mendiola, Pale Mike Crisostomo, and myself. We, under the leadership of AG Barrett-Anderson along with dedicated staff, developed the operating procedures and application process based on the Guam Statutes regarding Compensation for Damages from Criminal Activity.

The CICC held its first hearing on April 8, 2016. Since then, we have received 189 applications and awarded 95 of those for an approximate award amount of \$680,000.

The commission members come from different backgrounds, and each contributes to providing an objective perspective in making decisions in each case that is presented. Although a medical background is not necessary to be a CICC member, it has been helpful in being able to provide a greater insight on the injuries that victims have suffered which may have an impact on how the commission awards an applicant.

My goal in becoming a physician has always been to provide healing. When individuals are victimized, there are physical and emotional injuries they live with. The CICC is not able to resolve the results of the trauma endured, but we may be able to be part of the healing process by acknowledging their injury and compensate them based on the guidelines of the statutes. Being part of the CICC is another way I can contribute to the healing of our island community.

As Attorney General of Guam, I submit testimony in support of Dr. Lisa Flores' reappointment to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC).

Dr. Lisa Flores was first appointed to the CICC by Governor Felix P. Camacho on April 16, 2006, and has been reappointed by all subsequent administrations to include current Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero.

Statutorily, the CICC has authority to provide victims with a wide range of compensation, such as compensation for medical expenses. Requests for medical compensation often range from emergency, in-patient, and ambulatory (i.e., treatment and rehabilitation) services; mental health and counseling services; and dental services. During her time on the CICC, Dr. Flores has lent her expertise when reviewing requests for compensation encompassing medical diagnosis, treatment and billing practices. It is with her unique skill set and heightened perception that the CICC has been able to ensure all requests for medical compensation and all other requests are accurately and efficiently reviewed. Furthermore, it should be said that I have witnessed Dr. Flores' thoughtful CICC decisions, temperament and visible compassion.

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§ 161.10. Definitions.

As used in this Chapter:

(a) ‘Child’ means an unmarried person who is under eighteen (18) years of age and includes a stepchild or an adopted child;

(b) ‘Commission’ means the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission established by this Chapter;

(c) ‘Dependents’ means relatives of a deceased or injured victim who were wholly or partially dependent upon the victim’s income at the time of the victim’s death or injury and includes the child of the victim born after the victim’s injury or death;

(d) ‘Injury’ means actual bodily harm and, in respect of a victim, includes pregnancy, and mental or nervous shock;

(e) ‘Person’ means a natural person;

(f) ‘Private citizen’ means any natural person other than a peace officer who is actively engaged in the performance of his or her duties;

(g) ‘Relative’ means a victim’s spouse, parent, grandparent, stepfather, stepmother, child, grandchild, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister or spouse’s parents; and

(h) ‘Victim’ means a person who is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the description of any of the crimes specified in Section 161.55 of this Chapter.

§ 161.15. Creation of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.

There is, within the government of Guam, a Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (Commission) which shall

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be comprised of five (5) members appointed by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* with the advice and consent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Annually, the members shall elect a chairperson of the Commission.

(a) In the absence of a quorum resulting from a vacancy, the Attorney General, or his Chief Deputy, are hereby granted the same powers and authority as the Commission under this Chapter to carry out the purposes and requirements of this Chapter.

§ 161.20. Tenure and Compensation of Members.

The term of office of each member of the Commission shall be four (4) years or until his successor is appointed, except that the terms of office of the members first taking office shall expire as designated by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* at the time of appointment as follows: one (1) at the end of one (1) year, one (1) at the end of two (2) years, one (1) at the end of three (3) years, and two (2) at the end of four (4) years. Any member appointed to fill the vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his or her predecessor was appointed, shall be appointed for the remainder of the term. A vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers. If any member of the Commission is unable to act because of absence, illness or other sufficient cause, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* may make a temporary appointment, and such appointee shall have all the powers and duties of a regular member of the Commission for the period of their appointment.

§ 161.25. Powers and Procedures of Commission.

Upon an application made to the Commission under this Chapter, the Commission shall fix a time and place for a hearing on such application and shall cause notice thereof to be given to the applicant. The Commission may hold such hearings, sit and

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act at such times and places, and take such testimony as the Commission may deem advisable. Any three (3) members shall constitute a quorum. The concurring vote of three (3) members shall be necessary to take any action. Any member of the Commission may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the Commission. The Commission shall have such powers of subpoena and compulsion of attendance of witnesses and production of documents and of examination of witnesses as are conferred upon the Superior Court. Subpoena shall be issued under the signature of the Chairman. The Superior Court may, upon the application of the Commission, enforce the attendance and testimony of any witness and the production of any documents so subpoenaed. Subpoena and witness fees and mileage shall be the same as in criminal cases in the Superior Court, and shall be payable from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

§ 161.30. Hearings and Evidence.

(a) Where any application is made to the Commission, the applicant and the Commission's legal advisor shall be entitled to appear and be heard. Any other person may appear and be heard who satisfied the Commission that he or she has a substantial interest in the proceedings. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is a child, the application may be made on his or her behalf by his or her parent or legal guardian. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is mentally defective, the application may be made on his or her behalf by his or her guardian or such other individual authorized to administer the estate.

(b) Where under this Chapter a person is entitled to appear and be heard by the Commission, that person may appear in person or by his or her attorney. All hearings shall be open to the public unless, in a particular case, the Commission determines that the hearing, or a portion thereto, should be held in private, having regard to the fact that the offender has not been convicted or to the interest of the victim of an alleged sexual offense.

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(c) Every person appearing under this Chapter shall have the right to produce evidence and to cross-examine witnesses. The Commission may receive as evidence any statement, document, information or matter that may, in the opinion of the Commission, contribute to its functions under this Chapter, whether or not such statement, document, information or matter would be admissible in a court of law.

(d) If any person has been convicted of any offense with respect to an act or omission on which a claim under this Chapter is based, proof of that conviction, unless an appeal against the conviction or a petition for a hearing in respect of the charge is pending or a new trial or rehearing has been ordered, shall be taken as conclusive evidence that the offense has been committed.

§ 161.35. Medical Examination.

The Commission may appoint an impartial licensed physician to examine any person making application under this Chapter, and the fees for the examination shall be paid from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

§ 161.40. Attorney Fees.

(a) The Commission may, as part of any order entered under this Chapter, determine and allow reasonable attorney fees, which if the award of compensation is more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the award, to be paid out of but not in addition to the award, to the attorneys representing the applicant; provided, that the amount of the attorney fees shall not, in any event, exceed the award of compensation remaining after deducting that portion thereof for expenses actually incurred by the claimant.

(b) Any attorney who charges, demands, receives or collects for services rendered in connection with any proceedings under

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this Chapter any amount in excess of that allowed under this Section, if any compensation is paid, shall be fined not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).

§ 161.45. Reconsideration by Commission; Judicial Review.

(a) The Commission may, on its own motion or on the application of any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the Commission, reconsider the order or decision and revoke, confirm and verify the order or decision, based upon the findings of the Commission.

(b) Any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the Commission on the sole ground that the order or decision was in excess of the Commission's authority or jurisdiction, shall have a right of appeal to the Superior Court; provided, that the appeal is filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after service of an original or a certified copy of such order or decision. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, orders and decisions of the Commission shall be conclusive and not subject to judicial review.

§ 161.50. Eligibility for Compensation.

(a) In the event any person is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the criminal jurisdiction of Guam after September 30, 1980, which act or omission is within the description of the crimes enumerated in Section 161.55, the Commission may, in its discretion, upon an application, order the payment of compensation in accordance with this Chapter:

(1) to or for the benefit of the victim;

(2) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the victim, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or

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incurred expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death;

(3) in the case of the death of the victim, to or for the benefit of any one (1) or more of the dependents of the deceased victim; or

(4) to a parent of an adult deceased victim, or to an adult son or daughter of a deceased victim, where the parent or adult son or daughter has incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury and death.

(b) For the purposes of this Chapter, a person shall be deemed to have intentionally committed an act or omission, notwithstanding that by reason of age, insanity, drunkenness or otherwise, he or she was legally incapable of forming a criminal intent.

(c) In determining whether to make an order under this Section, the Commission may consider any circumstances it determines to be relevant, and the Commission shall consider the behavior of the victim, and whether, because of provocation or otherwise, the victim bears any share of responsibility for the crime that caused his or her injury or death, and the Commission shall reduce the amount of compensation in accordance with its assessment of the degree of such responsibility attributable to the victim.

(d) An order may be made under this Section whether or not any person is prosecuted for or convicted of a crime arising out of an act or omission described in Subsection (a) of this Section; provided, that an arrest has been made or such act or omission has been reported to the police without undue delay. No order may be made under this Section unless the Commission finds that:

(1) the act or omission did occur; and

(2) the injury or death of the victim resulted from the act or omission.

(e) Upon application from either the Attorney General or the Chief of Police, the Commission may suspend proceedings

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under this Chapter for such period as it deems desirable on the ground that a prosecution for a crime arising out of the act or omission has been commenced or is imminent, or that release of the investigation report would be detrimental to the public interest.

(f) If a resident of Guam is a victim of a crime as defined in Section 161.55 of this Chapter, but the crime occurred outside the boundaries of Guam, the resident has the same rights under the provisions of this Chapter as if the crime had occurred within Guam upon a showing that the state, territory, country or political subdivision of a country in which the crime occurred does not have a crime victim's compensation law which covers the injury or death suffered by the resident.

§ 161.55. Violent Crimes.

(a) The crimes to which this Chapter applies are the following:

- (1) Aggravated Murder (9 GCA § 16.30);
- (2) Murder (9 GCA § 16.40);
- (3) Manslaughter (9 GCA § 16.50);
- (4) Aggravated Assault (9 GCA § 19.20);
- (5) Assault (9 GCA § 19.30);
- (6) Kidnapping (9 GCA § 22.20);
- (7) Felonious Restraints (9 GCA § 22.30);
- (8) Child Stealing (9 GCA § 22.40);
- (9) Custodial Interference (9 GCA § 22.50);
- (10) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the First Degree (9 GCA § 25.15);
- (11) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Second Degree (9 GCA § 25.20);

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(12) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Third Degree (9 GCA § 25.25);

(13) Criminal Sexual Conduct in the Fourth Degree (9 GCA § 25.30);

(14) Assault with Intent to Commit Criminal Sexual Conduct (9 GCA § 25.35);

(15) Driving While Impaired (9 GCA § 92102);

(16) Driving While Impaired With Child On Board: Felony Punishment (9 GCA § 92109), provided a child under the age of sixteen (16) was injured as a result of an accident in which the vehicle operated by the person charged with the above violation was involved;

(17) Vehicular Negligence: Bodily Injuries (9 GCA § 92108);

(18) Vehicular Homicide While Driving Impaired: Felony Punishment (9 GCA § 92111);

(19) Drinking While Driving a Motor Vehicle: Misdemeanor: Punishment (9 GCA § 92112);

(20) Stalking (9 GCA § 19.70);

(21) Family Violence (Third Degree Felony and Misdemeanor) and Violation of a Court Order (Misdemeanor) (9 GCA Chapter 30);

(22) Solicitation of Children and Child Pornography (9 GCA Chapter 25A);

(23) Robbery (9 GCA Chapter 40);

(24) Aggravated Arson and Arson (9 GCA §§ 34.20 and 34.30);

(25) Home Invasion (9 GCA §§ 37.210 and 37.220);
and

(26) Carjacking (9 GCA §§ 37.310, 37.320, and 37.330).

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(b) For the purpose of this Chapter, the operation of a motor vehicle, boat, or aircraft that results in an injury or death *shall not* constitute a crime, unless the injuries were intentionally inflicted through the use of such vehicle, boat, or aircraft or unless the conduct constitutes a violation of 9 GCA § 92101, et seq. (The Safe Streets Act).

(c) Any fine imposed pursuant to 9 GCA § 80.50 of for conviction of any crimes specified in Subsections (a)(1) through (14) and (20) through (26) of this Section *shall* be paid into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund established by § 161.90 of this Chapter.

§ 161.60. Award of Compensation.

The Commission may order, only from available balances in the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund, the payment of compensation under this Chapter for:

- (a) expenses actually and reasonably incurred as a result of the injury or death of the victim;
- (b) loss to the victim of earning power as a result of total or partial incapacity;
- (c) pecuniary loss to the dependents of the deceased victim;
- (d) pain and suffering to the victim; and
- (e) any other pecuniary loss directly resulting from the injury or death of the victim which the Commission determines to be reasonable and proper.

§ 161.70. Recovery from Offender.

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Whenever any person is convicted of an offense that includes any crime enumerated in Section 161.55 of this Chapter and an order for the payment of compensation is or has been made under this Chapter for injury or death resulting from the act or omission constituting such offense, the Commission may institute a derivative action in the Superior Court against the person or against any person liable at law on his or her behalf, in the name of the victim or such of his or her dependents as have been awarded compensation under this Chapter, for such damages as may be recoverable at common law by the victim or such dependents without reference to the payment of compensation. The court shall have jurisdiction to hear, determine and render judgment in any such action. The time of the occurrence of the act or omission until conviction of the offense and, thereafter, as long as the offender is in confinement for conviction of the offense, shall not constitute any part of the time limited for the commencement of the action by the Commission under the applicable statute of limitations. Any recovery in the action shall belong to the government of Guam; provided, that the Commission shall amend its order of compensation to provide for the payment of any portion of the recovery in excess of the amount of compensation prescribed in the order to any of the persons entitled to receive compensation under Section 161.50 of this Chapter in such proportions and upon such terms as the Commission shall deem appropriate.

§ 161.71. Fines Imposed on Offenders.

Whenever a fine is imposed upon an offender and such fine is to be deposited into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund, and such fine is not to be deposited into the fund within one hundred eighty (180) days of the imposition of sentence, the Commission may institute a civil action in Superior Court against the offender to recover the amount of such fine, provided, however, the offender is not in the process of seeking judicial review of such conviction. The statutes of limitation for commencing such civil action shall be tolled while the offender is absent from Guam or incarcerated in any facility whatsoever.

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Any recovery from the offender, excluding costs and attorney fees, shall be deposited into the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

§ 161.75. Eligibility for Compensation.

In the event a private citizen incurs injury or property damage in preventing the commission of a crime within Guam, in apprehending a person who has committed a crime within Guam, or in materially assisting a peace officer who is engaged in the prevention or attempted prevention of such a crime or the apprehension or attempted apprehension of such a person, the Commission may, in its discretion, upon an application, order the payment of compensation in accordance with this Chapter:

(a) to or for the benefit of the private citizen; or

(b) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the private citizen, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses as a result of the private citizen's injury.

§ 161.80. Award of Compensation.

The Commission may order the payment of compensation under this Chapter for:

(c) loss to the private citizen of earning power as a result of total or partial incapacity; and

(d) pecuniary loss to the private citizen directly resulting from damage to his or her property.

§ 161.85. Terms of Order.

Except as otherwise provided in this Chapter, any order for the payment of compensation under this Chapter may be made on such terms as the Commission deems appropriate. Without limiting the generality of the preceding sentence, the order may provide for apportionment of the compensation, for the holding of the compensation or any part thereof in trust, for the payment of the compensation in a lump sum or periodic installments, and for the payment of compensation for hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses directly to the person who has provided such services. All such orders shall contain words clearly informing the claimant that all awards and orders for payments under this Chapter are subject to the making of an appropriation by *I Liheslatura* to pay the claim, except as otherwise provided in Section 161.95 of this Chapter.

§ 161.90. Limitations Upon Award of Compensation.

(a) No order for the payment of compensation shall be made under this Chapter unless the application has been made within eighteen (18) months after the date of injury, death or property damage.

(b) Compensation for medical expenses may be awarded up to the amount of Twenty Thousand Dollars (\$20,000.00) and compensation for all other purposes allowed under this Chapter shall not exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

§ 161.95. Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund; When Payment Authorized.

The Attorney General shall be the certifying officer of the Fund, and all payments therefrom shall be paid by the Attorney General upon order of the Commission. These funds shall not be transferred or used without the written approval of the Attorney General of Guam.

(b) The Commission shall have the authority to seek and accept on behalf of, and in the name of, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund from any government or agency thereof, or any person, natural or legal, advisory services, grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or money and other property for the benefit of the Fund; provided, however, that any such grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or other assistance shall not involve any obligation on the part of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

(c) Where the Commission has made an award pursuant to this Chapter, the Commission shall make such payments from the Fund to or on behalf of the victim, or to or for the benefit of one (1) or more of the dependents of a deceased victim, or to or for the benefit of other persons who have suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death. Payments made pursuant to this Section shall not exceed the total amount of the award.

(d) The Attorney General shall transmit semi-annually to *I Maga'lahañ Guåhan* and to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a report of the Commission's activities under this Chapter, including the name of each applicant, a brief description of the facts in each case, and the amount, if any, of compensation awarded. Such reports shall be due no later than January 30 and June 30 of each year. The Attorney General shall transmit the report, together with a tabulation of the total amount of compensation awarded.

§ 161.100. Recovery From Collateral Source.

(a) In determining the amount of compensation to be awarded under this Chapter, the Commission shall deduct amounts or benefits received or to be received from any source, whether from the offender or from any person on behalf of the offender, or from public or private funds, and which amounts or benefits result from or are in any manner, directly or indirectly, attributable to the injury or death which gave rise to the award; provided, that no deduction shall be made for death benefits received or to be received under any insurance policy covering the life of a deceased victim.

(b) Where compensation is awarded under this Chapter and the person receiving the same also receives any sum required to be, and that has not been deducted under Subsection (a) of this Section, he or she shall refund to the government of Guam the lesser of the sum or the amount of the compensation paid to him or her under this Chapter.

§ 161.101. Sale of Recollections, Thoughts, and Feelings of Convicted Person.

(a) A person convicted of a crime shall not derive any profit from the sale of his or her recollections, thoughts, and feelings with regard to the offense committed by that person until the victim receives any restitution or compensation ordered for him or her against the defendant and expenses of incarceration are recovered as provided in Subsection (c) and until the escrow account created under Subsection (b) is terminated under Subsection (d).

(b) Upon the conviction of a defendant for a crime involving a victim, and after notice to any interested party, the Attorney General may petition the court in which the conviction occurred to order that defendant forfeit all or any part of proceeds received or to be received by the defendant, or the defendant's representatives or assignees, from contracts relating to the depiction of the crime or the defendant's recollections, thoughts, or feelings about the crime, in books, magazines, media entertainment, or live entertainment, as provided in this

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Section. The proceeds shall be held in escrow for a period of not more than five (5) years.

(c) During the existence of the escrow account, proceeds in the account shall be distributed in the following priority to satisfy the following:

(1) An order of restitution entered under Sections 24 and 25.

(2) Any civil judgment in favor of the victim against that defendant.

(d) The balance remaining in the escrow account at the end of the escrow period shall be paid to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

➤ **What is the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program?**

If you or a loved one is a victim of crime, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program can provide financial reimbursement for crime-related expenses to ease some of the financial burden you may face.

➤ **Who can apply?**

Victims, Dependents, Parents, Guardians or any other persons who have incurred expenses as a result of a Victim's injury or death.

➤ **How do I know if a Victim is eligible?**

- a. Victim died *or* was injured;
- b. Crime is at least one (1) of the crimes listed in 8 G.C.A. § 161.55;
- c. Crime occurred in Guam, or if crime did not occur in Guam, Victim is a resident of Guam and place where crime occurred does not have a criminal injuries compensation program;
- d. Arrest made or crime reported to police without undue delay;
- e. Application made within 18 months of Victim's injury or death;

[Disclaimer: applicants should not assume they qualify or do not qualify for compensation. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Program reviews each case to determine eligibility; and refers all eligible cases to the Commission for final review and possible award]

➤ **What expenses may be covered?**

- a. Medical Expenses
- b. Funeral / Burial Costs
- c. Loss of Wages
- d. Property damage incurred as a result of the crime or incident;
- e. Any qualifying costs incurred as a result of the crime or incident;

➤ **How much compensation can the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission award?**

- a. Medical expenses not to exceed \$20,000
- b. All other expenses not to exceed \$10,000

➤ **What is the Process?**

- a. You must complete the application form that can be provided to you by our office or you may access it online on our website at www.guamag.org.
- b. Completed applications must be submitted to our office in person or by mail;
- c. You will receive a letter of eligibility or ineligibility within 20 days of submitting your application;
- d. If you are determined eligible, you will be contacted by the Program Coordinator or Program Administrator for an interview to collect all necessary documentation and receipts;
- e. After the interview, you will be informed of the date and time of hearing before the Commission;

Guidelines for Applying for Crime Victim Compensation

An application must be completed and filled out for each victim. If the victim is a minor or incompetent adult, the person filling out the form for the victim must be an adult who is responsible for the victim's welfare. Please fill out this application as completely and accurately as possible. Claims will be thoroughly investigated and verified. Incomplete applications will be not processed.

You *may* qualify for financial assistance through Guam's Criminal Injuries Compensation Program if you satisfy the eligibility requirements as follows:

- a) You are filing this application within 18 months from date of injury, death or property damage;
- b) Arrest made *OR* crime reported to police without undue delay;
- c) The act or omission resulted in the death or injury to the victim;
- d) The crime occurred in Guam, *OR* if crime did not occur in Guam, Victim is a resident of Guam and place where crime occurred does not have a criminal injuries compensation program;
- e) The act or omission resulted from a violent crime enumerated in 8 G.C.A. § 161.55;

An initial review of eligibility will be conducted by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program and ultimate determination of award will be made by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission pursuant to Guam law. The application is available at the Office of the Attorney General, Victim Service Center or on our website at www.guamag.org.

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:47 AM. The appointment of Denise M. Mendiola, to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, was the second item on the agenda.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: *Håfa Adai.* The committee on Health, Land, Justice and Culture. Today's Wednesday, June 23rd, 2021, and the time is 10:32 AM. Notices for this virtual confirmation hearing were disseminated via email to all Senators and all main media broadcasting outlets on Wednesday, June 16 and Monday, June 21. The notice was also published in the bomb daily post on Wednesday, June 16 and Monday, June 21st, 2021. This zoom meeting is hosted by the Legislature's MIS staff and committee staff and I thank them for their assistance. The host will mute all zoom participants until called upon by the Chair. Individuals testifying shall first be recognized by the Chair before speaking and begin by stating their name for record keeping purposes. When called to speak, please ensure that you are un-muted.

We have one agenda item and that is the appointment of Dr. Lisa D. Flores to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission for a term length of four years from April 1st, 2020, to March 31st, 2024. I'd like to acknowledge my colleagues who have joined us this morning, beginning with the Minority Leader, Senator Chris Duenas, Senator Anthony Ada, Senator Joanne Brown. *Si Yu'os ma'åse* for joining us. I'd also like to acknowledge the presence today of the nominee, Dr. Lisa Flores, also the Chairperson of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, *Pale'* Mike Crisostomo. Thank you, *Pale'* and members of the Attorney General's Office for being here, including Deputy Attorney General Fred Nishihira and Assistant Attorney General Janice Camacho.

So, we will now hear a testimony on behalf of the nominee and then hear from the nominee herself. I want to thank you, Dr. Flores, for your willingness to serve again on this commission. We realized this is another four-year term and thank you for your service on this commission, despite your busy schedule. We will begin with Deputy AG Fred Nishihira.

She's a valued asset to this because as you know, many of the victims who come before the commission have medical bills and have challenges, medical challenges, and a lot of hospital bills that are really in the thousands. Dr. Lisa has an eye for this and thank God she's on board because a lot of the medical terms, a lot of the procedures and things like that are indicated in some of the testimonies and receipts that we review, but she has a way of just kind of translating that and looking at it and then just questioning victims. Not questions of putting blame, but questions of clarity which is very important because the commission wants to understand what it is that they're going through. How's it that they're going through all of this and how can we help them best?

Dr. Lisa really provides that for us and the commission. I am just grateful for her presence there. She has a very calm demeanor about herself. She's very confident in that. I know she's challenged at times because she has her practice and she cares a lot and she brings passion and of course, charity too on the commission work. I have no doubt that she's committed, and I know often enough she always says that she's retired from the commission. For the three of us we've been in this work for so long that we feel like we are ready to retire, but because of our passion for this work and we understand the victims and those other people that we work with, as long as the support is there from the office of the Attorney General, from the Legislature, from the Governor, we will continue to do this as long as we're able to do it. I'm sure Dr. Lisa feels the same way. I'm sure we could go on a vacation, stay somewhere and it's relaxing, but we find comfort knowing that we're able to utilize the funds that have been allotted to be able to help people in need, and these people truly are in need. I just thank her personally for volunteering her time and commitment to the commission work. I plead with the Legislature, Senators please swiftly as well with all the confidence that you have to be able to pass her nomination and a confirmation. Thank you very much.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you, *Pale' Mike*, Chairperson of the Commission. I like to take this time to recognize the presence as well this morning of Senator Telo Taitague. Thank you, Senator, for joining us. We'll now hear from Deputy AG Fred Nishihira.

Fred Nishihira, Deputy Attorney General: Thank you Madam Speaker, Senators. Once again, I will read from the office of Leevin Camacho.

"Håfa Adai Madam Speaker. As Attorney General of Guam, I submit testimony in support of Dr. Lisa Flores' reappointment to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC).

Dr. Lisa Flores was first appointed to the CICC by Governor Felix P. Camacho on April 16, 2006, and has been reappointed by all subsequent administrations to include current Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero.

Statutorily, the CICC has authority to provide victims with a wide range of compensation, such as compensation for medical expenses. Requests for medical compensation often range from emergency, in-patient, and ambulatory (i.e., treatment and rehabilitation) services; mental health and counseling services; and dental services. During her time on the CICC, Dr. Flores has lent her expertise when reviewing requests for compensations encompassing medical diagnosis, treatment and billing practice. It is with her unique skill set and heightened perception that the CICC has been able to ensure all requests for medical compensation and all other requests are accurately and efficiently reviewed. Furthermore, it should be said that I have witnessed Dr. Flores' thoughtful CICC decisions, temperament and visible compassion

For these reasons, it is without reservation that I support Dr. Flores' reappointment to the CICC. Should you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me personally.

I will also just testify as the Deputy that oversees the employees that work with the CICC on these matters. Dr. Flores is an extremely, very busy person. I think it goes without saying. Just like AG Camacho's testimony. Is that having a medical doctor on the commission to evaluate medical claims is just invaluable. Despite her extremely busy schedule, I have seen her take time and time again. I'll give one quick example where she had to take the ethics class. She stuck with us, we worked together, and it takes a long block of time to take that course at the University of Guam. So, despite the scheduling disputes she could have easily said, you know what? I've served my time thank you very much. We

really appreciate it and this goes to all the members, but Dr. Flores, just knowing how tight her schedule is. She has made time for the victims of Guam. We appreciate her personal time that she's taking out to make it work. We've seen that, and I've also seen Dr. Flores take the helm when it comes to medical claims and especially in the part where it's the nine parts of a claim.

That's always the hard part, because usually, the crime is violent, crime involves injury, but like I said in previous testimony, the hardest part is when you see the injured person before you, and you have to deny a part, but award a certain part. So, I've seen Dr. Flores kind of dissect it and say, this part of the claim we can award because this is all related, but this portion was a pre existing medical condition and she she's able to communicate that in a way that I haven't seen an upset victim walk away from that process, even being told, no, we can't award that part of the claim. Her balance is very good. It's really a very well-balanced commission, and she adds a lot of value to it. So, I do recommend support for Dr. Flores and thank her for her service too, on behalf of all victims of law. Thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much and thanks to the Attorney General as well for his testimony. We will not recognize Assistant Attorney General, Janice Camacho.

Janice Camacho, Assistant Attorney General: Thank you so much Madam Speaker and the rest of the Guam Legislature. I speak in my personal capacity, as I mentioned, again. However, I am Legal Counsel to the Criminal Injuries Compensation. Dr. Flores as a physician has been an ideal candidate for this commission as just stated in the AG's testimony, which was just read by Deputy Attorney General Fred Nishihira. A significant request for medical compensation came before the CICC.

In fact, under Guam law, the commission is able to make awards up to \$20,000 in medical compensation. Dr. Flores as a medical doctor is able to dissect these requests like we mentioned, like Fred just mentioned, for compensation and determine that they're justified or comport with one law. I strongly support her reappointment and I'm sorry. I should not end without adding that she's a decent person. She's a decent human being. We'd like to see her continue on this commission and I'm excited to continue working with her should she be reappointed, thank you.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much Assistant AG Camacho. We'll now hear from the nominee Dr. Lisa Flores.

Dr. Lisa Flores Nominee: Hi, good morning. Can everyone hear me? I'd like to thank all of those that have spoken on my behalf. It has been a struggle trying to determine whether I want to continue on this commission again, just because of the time constraints. Again, as *Pale'* Mike said we're doing it for the victims and that's really kind of the focus and why I agreed to continue on. So, if you guys don't mind, yes. They say I have a common, relaxed demeanor, but certainly when you are the focal point of all of this. I'm going to go ahead and read and open up for any questions, if you have any directed towards me.

Fred did mention a few things in regard to the background. So, I'm going to just go ahead and read through that. I do have some of that already in my statements. Again, just to introduce myself, I'm Dr. Lisa Flores. I'm a primary care physician working at both the SDA clinic as well as the public health clinics primarily in insurance.

I have been appointed by Governor Lou Leon Guerrero to continue serving in the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. My initial appointment was back in 2006, and that was under the Camacho Moylan administration. Certainly, at that time, the goal was to restart the commission, which really wasn't functioning at that time. The request was to have someone with that medical background who could certainly take time out of their busy schedule to be certainly a part of that particular team. Now, although I was confirmed by the 28th Guam Legislature, the commission never became a fully functioning entity during that time.

I was reappointed under the Camacho Cruz administration, but was unable to fulfill the obligations again because of some scheduling issues. I was asked to join the CICC in the Calvo Tenorio administration and was confirmed to serve from 2012 to 2016 and then again, from 2016 to 2020. A little bit more background during Leonardo Rapadas' term as Attorney General, attempts were made to get the CICC to start reviewing the applications that had already been submitted and were sitting, waiting for review. It wasn't until Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson became the Attorney General in 2015 that the CICC was resurrected. Those that were serving at the time and continued to serve up until now included Denise Mendiola, *Pale'* Mike Crisostomo, and myself. We, under the leadership of AG Barrett-Anderson, along with dedicated staff, applaud them because without their assistance, we really wouldn't have the CICC and there we all, as a group, certainly develop the operating procedures and the application process based on the Guam statutes. At that time, we only had the statutes, and we didn't have much of anything else. The CICC held its first hearing on April 8th, 2016, and since then, there may have already been

discussions during the other commission hearings. We did receive about eight hundred, one hundred and eighty-nine applications and have awarded about 95 of those. The approximate costs that I've seen in regards to the award that we've submitted so far have been around 680,000.

Now the commission members come certainly from different backgrounds and each contributes to providing an objective perspective and making decisions in each case that is presented, and although a medical background is not necessary to be part of the CICC membership, it certainly has been helpful in being able to provide a greater insight on the injuries that victims have suffered, which can have an impact on how we certainly award.

My goal and becoming a physician have again, always been to provide healing and certainly when individuals are victimized, there are physical and emotional injuries that they have and the CICC recognizes not being able to resolve the results of the trauma, but certainly we can be a part of that healing process.

I think by acknowledging their injury and certainly compensating them based on the guidelines of the statute, certainly we can do that and so again, being part of the CICC is another way that I feel like I contribute to the healing of our island community. I'm going to end with, thank you again for accommodating me. I know that originally the goal was to try and get this done at about nine, but again, a busy schedule. I appreciate the opportunity to be able to present.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you very much, Dr. Flores and again, thank you so much for being present today, making time in your schedule. I apologize for the inconvenience of it, but we do hope to get your confirmation on the next session agenda, which is going to be our session beginning on Friday and hopefully we will vote by next Friday. We will hope to get any action that this commission does. To be very firm that all the members are confirmed. So, again, thank you. It's really incredible, 15 years of service on this commission. As you said, you can't address all the harm that has been done to these victims, but you are doing for all of us part of that work in the healing and I very much appreciate it. I appreciate you and all the commission members and thanks again. *Pale'* Mike discussed earlier this morning how you and Ms. Mendiola had really been the ones to establish everything that needed to be set up in this commission. So, I want to thank you for that extra work as well, that there, it was not an easy job walking into and following what had been already set up. So, thank you again for that. I'm going to ask you just a couple of questions to put on the record. First of all, do you have any continuing business that may be a conflict of interest for you to continue as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission?

Dr. Lisa D. Flores, Nominee: No, not at this time.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: And you've been able to attend the meetings obviously for 15 years. Do you foresee that will be an issue in the upcoming term

Dr. Lisa D. Flores, Nominee: Not at this time and again with trying to deal with this pandemic, we've been able to utilize technology. Certainly, in ways that we probably didn't have or recognized before. So, utilizing this, and again, I can't underestimate the staff and certainly I'm really grateful for them. I think they are the ones that really make the commission as the members, we review, but they really are the ones that do the background work that they don't always get the thanks for. I appreciate their ability for the whole group to accommodate my schedule. For that, I am thankful, and I don't foresee any issues with the scheduling.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: The attorney General's office representatives, they've described here in an earlier hearing, how it takes a time even before the meeting for you to review the files and to review their analysis, so it's a lot more work that goes into it than just the hours that are spent during the meetings themselves. You've been on this commission for 15 years now, and I just want to encourage you. You could suggest any additional changes to the law that you think are necessary or would further assist victims. *Pale'* Mike described earlier that you were able, you as a commission have been able to process claims pretty much within 30 days and that's excellent, but if there's any other impediment that you feel to bring healing to these victims, we are open for all your recommendations and suggestions, especially people with experience like each of you. Go ahead.

Dr. Lisa D. Flores, Nominee: We have certainly discussed a few things that need to be kind of worked out with the statutes, but again, I don't have that legal sort of background and I kind of lean towards our legal staff to kind of assist with that. So, I'm sure that they can provide additional recommendations in regards to the statutory amendments. In working out each of the applications, there's always a little bit of a nuance that could be better again dealt with if our statutes had a few changes to it, but we understand that requires a whole other entity component.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: We're open to that, and I don't think it's as difficult as all of that. We can definitely work with you. So, thank you. *Pale'* Mike, we'll look forward to

those suggestions. I'm going to open it now to the panel, beginning with the Minority Leader, Senator Chris Duenas.

Senator Christopher M. Duenas: *Si Yu'os ma'åse* Madam Speaker and Dr. Flores. Thank you once again, with your busy schedule for accepting the Governor's excellent nomination of yourself. Thank you for providing the historical background in terms of all of your journey through this endeavor and in absolute due respect to your time, I have no questions and I just want to say you have my full support, and I think the picture in your background explains exactly who you are, and I've been enjoying that as I've watched your testimony. Jesus is the true healer. *Si Yu'os ma'åse* and certainly you have my support.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: *Si Yu'os ma'åse* Senator Duenas. Senator Ada, you are recognized.

Senator V. Anthony Ada: Thank you. Madam Speaker, Madam Chair. Dr. Flores, thank you again. This is your third governor you're going through as a commission member, and it just shows the compassion that you have. I just look forward to you serving again on the board and you'll have my full support and thank you, Dr. Flores for all that to do.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: *Si Yu'os ma'åse* Senator Ada. Senator Brown, you're recognized.

Senator Joanne M. Brown: Thank you very much Madam Speaker, certainly very impressed with the contribution that Dr. Flores is making aside from the responsibility she has as a medical doctor, to serve on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Committee. Of course, as we talked earlier this morning with the other nominees, the challenge is, these victims have had to go through to come to the commission and then certainly the commission to review their cases and hopefully give them just compensation for what they've gone through. It's not an easy job, but certainly one that's needed and one that certainly provides additional support and hopefully eases some of the burden these victims in our community have been through.

For purposes of disclosure, Dr. Flores is my doctor. So, I certainly know her from that side, and she is certainly a wonderful physician. I think she's been my doctor since she worked at SDA, and it's been a number of years. So, I can say firsthand in terms of her profession,

her demeanor and how she contributes to the community. I think it's commendable and we certainly appreciate Dr. Flores' desire to continue to serve. I mean, sometimes the busiest people get challenged with more work to do, but the work you do is very important all around. So, I don't have any questions, but I certainly want to thank you again for your contribution and your continued service and also all the members of our community here that have come to testify on your behalf and also on behalf of all their fellow nominees that were on the agenda this morning. The work that you do, there's parts of our society that are not the most enjoyable and things that we wish we could see better in our community, but certainly the work you're doing to help ease some of that burden is something that's very valued by us.

So, thank you for your continued service to our community with that Madam Speaker, thank you for the opportunity to provide comment.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you Senator Brown. Senator Taitague, you recognize.

Senator Telo T. Taitague: Thank you, Madam Speaker. Thank you, Dr. Flores for deciding to stay in your busy schedule, I greatly appreciate it. My door's always open if there's any concerns or assistance that I can provide for you. One thing that you mentioned earlier, which I thought was very good, was the fact that you recognize the staff and all the hard work that they're doing. That was very commendable of you to do that, because it takes more than just a person. It takes a village and I commend you for recognizing them. Thank you for reminding us about that. I appreciate it. I wish you the very best and again, my door's always open to you. Congratulations and you have my support. Thank you, Dr. Flores.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you again to all those who've testified. Dr. Flores, is there any other comment you would like to make before we conclude the hearing? Dr. Flores?

Dr. Lisa Flores, Nominee: No, not at this time.

Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje: Thank you. There being no further testimony, I would just like to thank you very much for your continued willingness to serve on this commission for the time that you and all the members put in for the healing that you bring

to the victims of crime in Guam and for your continued advocacy for amendments to the law that would further serve these victims. *Si Yu'os ma'åse todus*, there being no further testimony. We will now consider the appointment of Dr. Lisa D. Flores to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, duly heard. It is 10:57 AM. This committee is adjourned. *Si Yu'os ma'åse*

The public hearing was adjourned at **10:57 AM.**
