



# NAVFAC Marianas: After artifacts collected, historic sites bulldozed

The military on Guam has confirmed historic sites found within infrastructure projects related to the relocation of Marines to the island have been leveled and more will be bulldozed to make way for facilities.

Naval Facilities Engineering Systems Command (NAVFAC) Marianas, which supports local activities of the U.S. military, clarified for The Guam Daily Post language included in two programmatic agreement memos issued for public comment, which said historic properties identified in areas affected by construction “will no longer be extant” once mitigation work was completed.

“Significant discoveries” that were identified through another, ongoing construction project in the area were data recovered, along with site information documented, according to the command. The development is taking place in a site the military calls North Finegayan, but the location has also been called Machanao pre-World War II, according to the memos.

“Recovered associated artifacts and any other resources that could be curated were collected and are properly stored pending turnover to the government of Guam upon the completion of the future cultural repository,” said JoAnna Delfin, public affairs officer for NAVFAC Marianas.

“Although traces of the site are removed, the information and location are documented in technical reports for future studies about the area and its environment, which contributes to the knowledge of Guam’s history and the CHamoru people.”

Several residents, community organizations and lawmakers have advocated for any historic or cultural discoveries found during military construction projects to be preserved in place or for any artifacts or other archaeological findings not to be further disturbed. NAVFAC also confirmed the historic sites previously identified have already been developed.

“All recoverable features are no

longer in place as the site has been graded to bedrock,” Delfin said.

NAVFAC Marianas said once a discovery is made, its location is documented with “sub-meter accuracy.” Collection efforts can include hand excavation, screening soil, and collecting soil and carbon samples. This type of mitigation work leaves a historic property with its “integrity diminished” and characteristics “altered,” according to the memos.

But not everything discovered was collected before it was subsequently leveled.

“While curation is an important part of the process, not every piece of an artifact was collected if it was determined that a sample can provide the same type of information,” Delfin said. “Although traces of the site are removed, the information and location are documented in technical reports for future studies about the area and its environment, which contributes to the knowledge of Guam’s history and the CHamoru people.”

# Taiwan staff leave HK amid 'one China' row

TAIPEI (Reuters) - Taiwanese staff working at the island's representative office in Hong Kong will begin leaving the Chinese-run city from Sunday, a senior official said, after the government there demanded its officials sign a document supporting Beijing's claim to Taiwan.

Chinese-ruled Hong Kong has become another bone of contention between Taipei and Beijing, especially after Taiwan lambasted a security law imposed on Hong Kong by Beijing and began welcoming Hong Kongers to settle on the island.

Lin Fei-fan, deputy secretary general of Taiwan's ruling Democratic Progressive Party, said only local staff would remain at the office.

"This is because the Chinese Communist Party and the Hong Kong government continue to force our personnel stationed in Hong Kong to sign a 'one China commitment letter' to recognize 'one China,'" he said on his Facebook page.

"As a political prerequisite for the visa renewal, we will of course not accept it!"

China sees democratically-ruled Taiwan as part of "one China" and has never renounced the use of force to bring the island under its control.

Lin said Taiwan would never accept "one China" or "one country, two systems", Beijing's way of running Hong Kong under Chinese sovereignty it hopes to one day apply to the island.

A senior Taiwan official familiar with the matter told Reuters seven Taiwan officials will return on Sunday afternoon, with the last remaining official to come back after visa expiry next month.

"It is not acceptable for us to be

politically diminished," the official said, pointing to the request to sign the document.

In a statement earlier on Sunday, Taiwan's Mainland Affairs Council said that since July 2018 the Hong Kong government has "repeatedly set unreasonable political conditions for staff visas for our Hong Kong office, demanding the signing of a 'One China Commitment Letter'".

Starting from Monday, the Hong Kong office will "adjust its business handling method," it added, saying the office will maintain "necessary operations".

Taiwanese staff will not sign any such "one China" letter, it added.

Last month, Hong Kong suspended operations at its Taiwan representative office, blaming Taipei's "gross" interference in internal affairs, including with its offer to assist "violent" protesters, accusations Taiwan rejected.

Macau's government followed suit on Wednesday.

# As Iran veers right, ties to Gulf Arab states hinge on nuke pact

DUBAI (Reuters) - Gulf Arab states are unlikely to be deterred from dialogue to improve ties with Iran after a hardline judge won the presidency but their talks with Tehran might become tougher, analysts said.

Prospects for better relations between Muslim Shi'ite Iran and Sunni Gulf Arab monarchies could ultimately hinge on progress to revive Tehran's 2015 nuclear accord with world powers, they said, after Ebrahim Raisi won Friday's election.

The Iranian judge and cleric, who is subject to U.S. sanctions, takes office in August, while nuclear talks in Vienna under outgoing President Hassan Rouhani, a more pragmatic cleric, are ongoing.

Saudi Arabia and Iran, longtime foes, began direct talks in April to contain tensions at the same time as global powers have been embroiled in nuclear negotiations.

"Iran has now sent a clear message that they are tilting to a more radical, more conservative position," said Abdulkhaleq Abdulla, a UAE political analyst, adding that Raisi's election might make improving Gulf ties a tougher challenge.

"Nevertheless, Iran is not in a position to become more radical ... because the region is becoming very difficult and very dangerous," he added.

The United Arab Emirates, whose commercial hub Dubai has been a trade gateway for Iran, and Oman, which has often played a regional

mediation role, were swift to congratulate Raisi.

Saudi Arabia and Bahrain are the only Gulf states yet to comment.

"The faces may change but the leader is (Supreme Leader Ayatollah Ali) Khamenei," columnist Khaled al-Suleiman wrote in Saudi newspaper Okaz.

Raisi, an implacable critic of the West and an ally of Khamenei, who holds ultimate power in Iran, has voiced support for continuing the nuclear negotiations.

"If the Vienna talks succeed and there is a better situation with America, then (with) hardliners in power, who are close to the supreme leader, the situation may improve," said Abdulaziz Sager, chairman of Gulf Research Center.

**§ 161.10. Definitions.**

As used in this Chapter:

(a) ‘Child’ means an unmarried person who is under eighteen (18) years of age and includes a stepchild or an adopted child;

(b) ‘Commission’ means the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission established by this Chapter;

(c) ‘Dependents’ means relatives of a deceased or injured victim who were wholly or partially dependent upon the victim’s income at the time of the victim’s death or injury and includes the child of the victim born after the victim’s injury or death;

(d) ‘Injury’ means actual bodily harm and, in respect of a victim, includes pregnancy, and mental or nervous shock;

(e) ‘Person’ means a natural person;

(f) ‘Private citizen’ means any natural person other than a peace officer who is actively engaged in the performance of his or her duties;

(g) ‘Relative’ means a victim’s spouse, parent, grandparent, stepfather, stepmother, child, grandchild, brother, sister, half-brother, half-sister or spouse’s parents; and

(h) ‘Victim’ means a person who is injured or killed by any act or omission of any other person coming within the description of any of the crimes specified in Section 161.55 of this Chapter.

**§ 161.15. Creation of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.**

There is, within the government of Guam, a Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (Commission) which shall

be comprised of five (5) members appointed by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* with the advice and consent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan*. Annually, the members shall elect a chairperson of the Commission.

(a) In the absence of a quorum resulting from a vacancy, the Attorney General, or his Chief Deputy, are hereby granted the same powers and authority as the Commission under this Chapter to carry out the purposes and requirements of this Chapter.

**§ 161.20. Tenure and Compensation of Members.**

The term of office of each member of the Commission shall be four (4) years or until his successor is appointed, except that the terms of office of the members first taking office shall expire as designated by *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* at the time of appointment as follows: one (1) at the end of one (1) year, one (1) at the end of two (2) years, one (1) at the end of three (3) years, and two (2) at the end of four (4) years. Any member appointed to fill the vacancy occurring prior to the expiration of the term for which his or her predecessor was appointed, shall be appointed for the remainder of the term. A vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its powers. If any member of the Commission is unable to act because of absence, illness or other sufficient cause, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan* may make a temporary appointment, and such appointee shall have all the powers and duties of a regular member of the Commission for the period of their appointment.

Upon an application made to the Commission under this Chapter, the Commission shall fix a time and place for a hearing on such application and shall cause notice thereof to be given to the applicant. The Commission may hold such hearings, sit and

act at such times and places, and take such testimony as the Commission may deem advisable. Any three (3) members shall constitute a quorum. The concurring vote of three (3) members shall be necessary to take any action. Any member of the Commission may administer oaths or affirmations to witnesses appearing before the Commission. The Commission shall have such powers of subpoena and compulsion of attendance of witnesses and production of documents and of examination of witnesses as are conferred upon the Superior Court. Subpoena shall be issued under the signature of the Chairman. The Superior Court may, upon the application of the Commission, enforce the attendance and testimony of any witness and the production of any documents so subpoenaed. Subpoena and witness fees and mileage shall be the same as in criminal cases in the Superior Court, and shall be payable from funds appropriated for expenses of administration.

**§ 161.30. Hearings and Evidence.**

(a) Where any application is made to the Commission, the applicant and the Commission's legal advisor shall be entitled to appear and be heard. Any other person may appear and be heard who satisfied the Commission that he or she has a substantial interest in the proceedings. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is a child, the application may be made on his or her behalf by his or her parent or legal guardian. In any case in which the person entitled to make an application is mentally defective, the application may be made on his or her behalf by his or her guardian or such other individual authorized to administer the estate.

(b) Where under this Chapter a person is entitled to appear and be heard by the Commission, that person may appear in person or by his or her attorney. All hearings shall be open to the public unless, in a particular case, the Commission determines that the hearing, or a portion thereto, should be held in private, having regard to the fact that the offender has not been convicted or to the interest of the victim of an alleged sexual offense.

(c) Every person appearing under this Chapter shall have the right to produce evidence and to cross-examine witnesses. The Commission may receive as evidence any statement, document, information or matter that may, in the opinion of the Commission, contribute to its functions under this Chapter, whether or not such statement, document, information or matter would be admissible in a court of law.

(d) If any person has been convicted of any offense with respect to an act or omission on which a claim under this Chapter is based, proof of that conviction, unless an appeal against the conviction or a petition for a hearing in respect of the charge is pending or a new trial or rehearing has been ordered, shall be taken as conclusive evidence that the offense has been committed.

(a) The Commission may, as part of any order entered under this Chapter, determine and allow reasonable attorney fees, which if the award of compensation is more than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) shall not exceed fifteen percent (15%) of the award, to be paid out of but not in addition to the award, to the attorneys representing the applicant; provided, that the amount of the attorney fees shall not, in any event, exceed the award of compensation remaining after deducting that portion thereof for expenses actually incurred by the claimant.

(b) Any attorney who charges, demands, receives or collects for services rendered in connection with any proceedings under

this Chapter any amount in excess of that allowed under this Section, if any compensation is paid, shall be fined not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00).

(b) Any person aggrieved by an order or decision of the Commission on the sole ground that the order or decision was in excess of the Commission's authority or jurisdiction, shall have a right of appeal to the Superior Court; provided, that the appeal is filed with the Commission within thirty (30) days after service of an original or a certified copy of such order or decision. Except as otherwise provided in this Section, orders and decisions of the Commission shall be conclusive and not subject to judicial review.

(1) to or for the benefit of the victim;

(2) to any person responsible for the maintenance of the victim, where that person has suffered pecuniary loss or

incurred expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death;

(3) in the case of the death of the victim, to or for the benefit of any one (1) or more of the dependents of the deceased victim; or

(4) to a parent of an adult deceased victim, or to an adult son or daughter of a deceased victim, where the parent or adult son or daughter has incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury and death.

(b) For the purposes of this Chapter, a person shall be deemed to have intentionally committed an act or omission, notwithstanding that by reason of age, insanity, drunkenness or otherwise, he or she was legally incapable of forming a criminal intent.

(c) In determining whether to make an order under this Section, the Commission may consider any circumstances it determines to be relevant, and the Commission shall consider the behavior of the victim, and whether, because of provocation or otherwise, the victim bears any share of responsibility for the crime that caused his or her injury or death, and the Commission shall reduce the amount of compensation in accordance with its assessment of the degree of such responsibility attributable to the victim.

(d) An order may be made under this Section whether or not any person is prosecuted for or convicted of a crime arising out of an act or omission described in Subsection (a) of this Section; provided, that an arrest has been made or such act or omission has been reported to the police without undue delay. No order may be made under this Section unless the Commission finds that:

(1) the act or omission did occur; and

(2) the injury or death of the victim resulted from the act or omission.

(e) Upon application from either the Attorney General or the Chief of Police, the Commission may suspend proceedings

under this Chapter for such period as it deems desirable on the ground that a prosecution for a crime arising out of the act or omission has been commenced or is imminent, or that release of the investigation report would be detrimental to the public interest.

(f) If a resident of Guam is a victim of a crime as defined in Section 161.55 of this Chapter, but the crime occurred outside the boundaries of Guam, the resident has the same rights under the provisions of this Chapter as if the crime had occurred within Guam upon a showing that the state, territory, country or political subdivision of a country in which the crime occurred does not have a crime victim's compensation law which covers the injury or death suffered by the resident.

The court shall have jurisdiction to hear, determine and render judgment in any such action. The time of the occurrence of the act or omission until conviction of the offense and, thereafter, as long as the offender is in confinement for conviction of the offense, shall not constitute any part of the time limited for the commencement of the action by the Commission under the applicable statute of limitations. Any recovery in the action shall belong to the government of Guam; provided, that the Commission shall amend its order of compensation to provide for the payment of any portion of the recovery in excess of the amount of compensation prescribed in the order to any of the persons entitled to receive compensation under Section 161.50 of this Chapter in such proportions and upon such terms as the Commission shall deem appropriate.

(b) The Commission shall have the authority to seek and accept on behalf of, and in the name of, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund from any government or agency thereof, or any person, natural or legal, advisory services, grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or money and other property for the benefit of the Fund; provided, however, that any such grants-in-aid, gifts, donations or other assistance shall not involve any obligation on the part of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

(c) Where the Commission has made an award pursuant to this Chapter, the Commission shall make such payments from the Fund to or on behalf of the victim, or to or for the benefit of one (1) or more of the dependents of a deceased victim, or to or for the benefit of other persons who have suffered pecuniary loss or incurred expenses on account of hospital, medical, funeral and burial expenses as a result of the victim's injury or death. Payments made pursuant to this Section shall not exceed the total amount of the award.

(d) The Attorney General shall transmit semi-annually to *I Maga'lahañ Guåhan* and to *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* a report of the Commission's activities under this Chapter, including the name of each applicant, a brief description of the facts in each case, and the amount, if any, of compensation awarded. Such reports shall be due no later than January 30 and June 30 of each year. The Attorney General shall transmit the report, together with a tabulation of the total amount of compensation awarded.

(b) Upon the conviction of a defendant for a crime involving a victim, and after notice to any interested party, the Attorney General may petition the court in which the conviction occurred to order that defendant forfeit all or any part of proceeds received or to be received by the defendant, or the defendant's representatives or assignees, from contracts relating to the depiction of the crime or the defendant's recollections, thoughts, or feelings about the crime, in books, magazines, media entertainment, or live entertainment, as provided in this

Section. The proceeds shall be held in escrow for a period of not more than five (5) years.

(c) During the existence of the escrow account, proceeds in the account shall be distributed in the following priority to satisfy the following:

(1) An order of restitution entered under Sections 24 and 25.

(2) Any civil judgment in favor of the victim against that defendant.

(d) The balance remaining in the escrow account at the end of the escrow period shall be paid to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Fund.

➤ **What is the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program?**

If you or a loved one is a victim of crime, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program can provide financial reimbursement for crime-related expenses to ease some of the financial burden you may face.

➤ **Who can apply?**

Victims, Dependents, Parents, Guardians or any other persons who have incurred expenses as a result of a Victim's injury or death.

➤ **How do I know if a Victim is eligible?**

- a. Victim died *or* was injured;
- b. Crime is at least one (1) of the crimes listed in 8 G.C.A. § 161.55;
- c. Crime occurred in Guam, or if crime did not occur in Guam, Victim is a resident of Guam and place where crime occurred does not have a criminal injuries compensation program;
- d. Arrest made or crime reported to police without undue delay;
- e. Application made within 18 months of Victim's injury or death;

*[Disclaimer: applicants should not assume they qualify or do not qualify for compensation. The Criminal Injuries Compensation Program reviews each case to determine eligibility; and refers all eligible cases to the Commission for final review and possible award]*

- a. Medical Expenses
- b. Funeral / Burial Costs
- c. Loss of Wages
- d. Property damage incurred as a result of the crime or incident;
- e. Any qualifying costs incurred as a result of the crime or incident;

➤ **How much compensation can the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission award?**

- a. Medical expenses not to exceed \$20,000
- b. All other expenses not to exceed \$10,000

➤ **What is the Process?**

- a. You must complete the application form that can be provided to you by our office or you may access it online on our website at [www.guamag.org](http://www.guamag.org).
- b. Completed applications must be submitted to our office in person or by mail;
- c. You will receive a letter of eligibility or ineligibility within 20 days of submitting your application;
- d. If you are determined eligible, you will be contacted by the Program Coordinator or Program Administrator for an interview to collect all necessary documentation and receipts;
- e. After the interview, you will be informed of the date and time of hearing before the Commission;

**Guidelines for Applying for Crime Victim Compensation**

An application must be completed and filled out for each victim. If the victim is a minor or incompetent adult, the person filling out the form for the victim must be an adult who is responsible for the victim's welfare. Please fill out this application as completely and accurately as possible. Claims will be thoroughly investigated and verified. Incomplete applications will be not processed.

You *may* qualify for financial assistance through Guam's Criminal Injuries Compensation Program if you satisfy the eligibility requirements as follows:

- a) You are filing this application within 18 months from date of injury, death or property damage;
- b) Arrest made *OR* crime reported to police without undue delay;
- c) The act or omission resulted in the death or injury to the victim;
- d) The crime occurred in Guam, *OR* if crime did not occur in Guam, Victim is a resident of Guam and place where crime occurred does not have a criminal injuries compensation program;
- e) The act or omission resulted from a violent crime enumerated in 8 G.C.A. § 161.55;

An initial review of eligibility will be conducted by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program and ultimate determination of award will be made by the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission pursuant to Guam law. The application is available at the Office of the Attorney General, Victim Service Center or on our website at [www.guamag.org](http://www.guamag.org).

## II. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY & DISCUSSION

The public hearing was Called-to-Order at 9:47 AM. The appointment of Denise M. Mendiola, to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, was the second item on the agenda.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** For the second item on our agenda is the reappointment of Denise M. Mendiola to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission for a term length of four years, April 1st, 2021, to March 31st, 2025. Ms. Mendiola, thank you for being here and *Si Yu'os ma'åse* for your service on this commission.

**Denise M. Mendiola, Nominee:** *Håfa adai*, good morning Speaker Terlaje and Senators.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** We also have testimony on your behalf by the Attorney General's office and Chairperson of the Commission *Pale' Mike Crisostomo*. So, I will recognize *Pale' Mike*.

***Pale' Mike Crisostomo, Chairperson, Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission:*** Thank you again Madam Speaker. On behalf of the commission, I testify in support of member Denise. She has been a valued component to our commission as well. She has worked tirelessly with Dr. Lisa and with Judge Elizabeth Barrett-Anderson when she was Attorney General, to ensure that the structure and the governance of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission has been established. You can consider her, and others, like her and Dr. Lisa as the founders, if you will, of the current Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. I think as long as she's willing to serve, she has my full support. It would sadden us dearly if she had to leave for any reason. She's highly respected. She brings her knowledge and her personal experience and passion and charity to the victims. I've seen her at work and in her questioning and line of questioning to the victims and working with us. We work dearly with each other to be able to do so with the priority that the victims that are before us are suffering. Certainly, Denise brings that element of charity and compassion to it.

So, Madam Speaker, she has my full support along with the other commission members, please swiftly as well confirm Ms. Denise Mendiola as a member.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** *Si Yu'os ma'åse Pale' Mike* and we will now recognize Deputy AG Fred Nishihira.

**Fred Nishihira, Deputy Attorney General:** Thank you Madam Speaker and Senators. Once again, on behalf of AOG Camacho, I am reading our testimony.

*"Håfa Adai Madam Speaker as Attorney General of Guam, I submit testimony in support of Ms. Denise Mendiola's reappointment to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission (CICC). Ms. Mendiola was first appointed to the CICC by Governor Eddie Baza Calvo on April 1, 2013, and nominated for reappointment by current Governor Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero. The role of the CICC is to provide financial assistance to ease the financial burdens victims of crime and their families face, and hopefully, help rebuild lives. In my time as Attorney General, I have found Ms. Mendiola to be eminently qualified to sit on the CICC. I can also say that as the division that oversees the CIC Commission, I have seen Ms. Mendiola work tirelessly. Just like *Pale' Mike* has said, I have seen. Personally, come in and read the files, get briefed. Hours upon hours to get ready for 20 hearings means each one of the commission members come in separately because we don't want to violate the Open Government Law and we have them briefed with our staff. So, I also want to give a shout out to our staff members that do that as well. I think the good thing, and it's amazing because I am thinking Pauline might look over my notes. Ms. Denise is also very fair in awarding claims. She sometimes asks hard questions, but fair questions of victims. It's at this point now that I consider her actually an expert in this area as a Commissioner of Criminal Injuries. I'll be quite honest, sometimes victims put in award claims for more than the law allows and she's pretty good at explaining why you're not going to get an award.

I think overall the great thing that Denise brings onto the commission issue, she brings a good atmosphere of chemistry. You know what I mean? So, when you have the three commission members working with you, it sounds almost like a joke, right? You bring a father, a doctor, and a businessperson together. She ties it in very well. They really do work together. They work hard, but you know what? You can see that they enjoy the work they do. That's very meaningful work and you can see it in her discussion, so I also highly recommend Denise Mendiola to the appointment and confirmation to the CICC.

Thank you very much Senators.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Thank you Deputy AG Nishihira. We'll now hear from assistant AG Janice.

**Janice Camacho, Assistant Attorney General, Attorney General of Guam:** In my official capacity, I would join in the AGS testimony, which was just read by Deputy Attorney General Fred Nishihira. However, I'd like to note that as Legal Counsel, and this is in my personal capacity. I've witnessed Denise Mendiola's eagerness and willingness to serve victims. I also want to add that she does have that discerning eye that Fred just mentioned when reviewing claims, what claims can be granted under Guam Law, and so she's fair. However, she has to scrutinize each claim to ensure that we're complying with Guam law. I just want to add that I strongly support her nomination, and I'm excited that we can continue this and that we continue this program together.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Thank you very much. Ms. Mendiola, you are now recognized, if you want to give any testimony

**Denise M. Mendiola, Nominee:** *Håfa adai*, good morning Speaker and Senators. Thank you for having me here today. I see Attorney Barrett-Anderson and *Pale'* Mike. I just want to tell you that I feel very privileged to be here again to be able to talk about the CICC, which is very near and dear to our hearts. It really is something to be said for our team and because we are a team now, the AG's office is just amazing. Their staff is so dedicated, so organized, and they make our job really easy, which is not an easy job because if you sit in there like we do, and you listen to the stories from the victims here in our community, these are people that we've known for years. Some people that we've met for the first time, things that we've heard in the news, and to hear from them, they're, heart-wrenching stories of the tragedy in their lives and to try to make them whole knowing that we're so limited with the resources and just trying to work within the parameters of the law, but then to be able to see their faces when we are able to provide them some source of semblance of hope that there is something that they can hold on to it. A lot of times, it's a matter of can they just

pay their bill at GMH.-. They had no part in this tragedy other than being a victim and something that has changed their life forever to know that our government is there to be able to provide them something. You can't walk away from these hearings without having a tear in your eye or crying and it takes a lot out of our team, all of us, the AG's team and our commission members. So again, I feel privileged to be here. This is volunteer work for all of us on the board, so we do take it seriously. We'd make sure to carve out time in our day to take leave. We take leave when we come and do these things and the idea behind the diversity on the board, I think is what *Pale' Mike* is speaking to that makes it work. You have *Pale' Mike*, you have Dr. Lisa, you have me, and then you have our fearless leader, which I'm so happy that she's back, Judge Barrett-Anderson. To have that diversity helps to provide really good and fair outcomes. There's still a lot of work that needs to be done and Judge Barrett-Anderson said this at the very beginning, and even when she was leaving, that there's still a lot of work and still some room for improvement. I think because we all have that background and experience from the very beginning, it's going to be a lot easier to be able to provide those recommended changes and improvements for future activities with the commission. So again, I just want to thank you for having me here today. I'm here to answer any questions that you may have of me and thank you.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Thank you Ms. Mendiola again for your service. This appointment would make your third, four-year term, if I'm calculating that correctly. I want to thank you as that's a lot of service. Thank you for describing that this is a work that really takes a personal toll on a person, and it's love work. You have to really care for these victims to hear these stories and to bear with them through it all. I know there's still a lot we can do for victims, but this has been a really huge improvement. So, I want to thank you for your work. As *Pale' Mike* described, you're getting even the structure of it to be something that will outlast. So, I think that that's something fantastic. So, thank you again. I'm going to ask you again, some questions just for the record.

Do you have any continuing business that may be a conflict of interest for you to continue as a member of this commission?

**Denise M. Mendiola, Nominee:** No.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** You've been able to attend the meetings, obviously. Are you going to be able to continue to do that now with your current work responsibilities as the Assistant Director of the Guam Community College, Continuing Education and Workforce Development?

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** We're looking to your program by the way, at GCC for huge things.

**Denise M. Mendiola, Nominee:** You took care of that just a few minutes ago when you approved the confirmation for Judge Barrett-Anderson. I think it's huge, and that was huge already.

Hopefully we're going to get these reports out as soon as possible, and we're going to put it up for vote in the next session, which begins on Friday and vote will probably be next Friday. Congratulations on this nomination and look forward to assisting you in any way I can. Thank you, Madam chair for the opportunity.

**Denise M. Mendiola, Nominee:** Thank you, Senator.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Thank you very much, Senator Taitague. Senator Ada, you are recognized.

**Senator V. Anthony Ada:** Thank you Madam Speaker. Madam Chair. Ms. Mendiola, thank you for accepting the Governor's nomination again to the board. I think the speaker is right, this is your third or second confirmation again. Eight years on the board and you still have that passion, compassion to continue on. My hats off to you. I look forward to working with you in any way possible, but whatever we can do to support the commission and any way that we can be there, what we need to do to ensure to make your job your time there rewarding and as simplified as possible to get these compensations through and out to the individuals. Thank you again for stepping up to the plate, and I look forward to supporting you on your confirmation. You have my support. Thank you. Thank you, Madam Chair.

Thank you, Ms. Mendiola. Thank you, Madam chair.

**Denise M. Mendiola, Nominee:** Thank you Senator.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Thank you Senator Moylan. Senator Brown, you are recognized.

**Senator Joanne M. Brown:** Thank you very much Madam Speaker. I certainly don't have any questions. I definitely appreciate the work that Ms. Mendiola has been doing for so many years and her contribution. I wasn't aware either that she had been serving so long on the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission, but I think just looking at the mix of the members that are there and the work that they do in their day-to-day lives, they'll continue to contribute. I certainly wish you well, Ms. Mendiola, thank you again for your public service. The work that you do with this commission is obviously not the easiest work to do, and what's involved in decisions. Sometimes tough decisions have to be made, but certainly we appreciate your service, because if it wasn't for those of you that are doing this, a lot of these victims may never feel a sense of peace or a sense of justice. So, I certainly appreciate all of your collective contributions, but also to you as well. Thank you very much.

**Chairperson Therese M. Terlaje:** Thank you Senator Brown. It's quite ironic, right? This Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission is to compensate for expenses or financial compensation. I'm sure that in your work, you are frustrated that it's not, it's more than that. There's no way that compensation financially for some of the crimes that have occurred, especially criminal sexual conduct and that type is anywhere near justice for them, but I hope it helps a little bit as you say, and I'm just going to read again what the law covers and I'm open to any suggestions that you have to amend this, and it covers medical expenses, funeral, and burial costs, loss of wages, property damage incurred as a result of the crime or incident and any qualifying costs incurred as a result of the crime or incident.

I can see on your face that this is very tough work and comes from your heart. I want to thank you again for the time, for the dedication, the thoroughness, the hard questions, all of it that you have put in the organization skills and all of it that you've put in to make this commission a success and to get to the compensation over as quickly as possible.

There being no further testimony on this appointment, the committee will consider the appointment of Denise M. Mendiola to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission duly heard. The time is now 10:06 AM. We will adjourn this hearing, but we will reconvene at 10:30 to hear the appointment of Dr. Lisa Flores to the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. *Si Yu'os ma'åse*, take care.

The public hearing was adjourned at **10:06 AM**.

### III. FINDINGS & RECOMMENDATIONS

- The re-appointment of Denise M. Mendiola to serve as a member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission received the support of the Attorney General Leevin Camacho, Deputy Attorney General Fred Nishihira, Assistant Attorney General Janice Camacho, and Pale' Mike Crisostomo, Chairperson of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission.
- The Committee finds that Denise M. Mendiola possesses the necessary experience, time and dedication to continue as an effective member of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission. Ms. Mendiola has served as a member of the Commission since 2013, and desires to continue to assist the Commission with its goal of assisting victims of crimes and their families financially to help ease the burdens caused by victimization. Ms. Mendiola has stated for the record her ability to attend commission meetings and that she is free of any conflicts that may place a burden on her ability to serve the Commission.
