**Relative to recognizing Lieutenant Freddy Untalan Hofschneider III of the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter *OLIVER HENRY* (WPC 1140) Coast Guard Forces Micronesia – Sector Guam; and commending him for his dedicated service in protecting Guam and the region's ocean waters.**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:**

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Freddy Untalan Hofschneider III, the son of the late Freddy U. Hofschneider Jr. and Rinenta R. Hofschneider, is a native of Tinian of the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI); and he earned his commission as an Officer of the U.S. Coast Guard Academy in 2013; and

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Hofschneider holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Operations Research and Computer Analysis from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy and a Master of Science degree in Industrial and Operations Engineering from the University of Michigan; and

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Hofschneider's first assignment was serving as a Deck Watch Officer aboard the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter (USCGC) *ASSATEAGUE* (WPB 1337) homeported in Apra Harbor, Guam from 2013 to 2014. Other subsequent afloat assignments include serving as the Assistant Operations Officer aboard the USCGC *JAMES* (WMSL 754) homeported in North Charleston, South Carolina from 2014 to 2017; as the Operations Officer aboard the USCGC *TIGLANT* (WMEC 617) homeported in Port Canaveral, Florida, from 2019 to 2021; and most recently, as the Commanding Officer aboard the USCGC *MAUI* (WPB 1304) homeported in Manama, Bahrain from 2021 to 2022; and

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Hofschneider also completed an ashore assignment as the Manpower Requirements Analysis Team Leader at the Manpower Requirements Determination Analysis Branch (CG-1B41) located in Millington, Tennessee. He was selected to serve as a Program Reviewer at the Office of Budget and Programs (CG-821) located at the USCG Headquarters in Washington D.C.; and

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Hofschneider's military decorations include a Meritorious Service Medal, two (2) Coast Guard Commendation Medals, a Commandant's Letter of Commendation, and multiple unit and team awards; and

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Hofschneider has had several operational accomplishments in his career. From June to July of 2022 during his CNMI Patrol, he patrolled two thousand three hundred (2,300) NMs within Guam and CNMI TTW providing overt presence coverage following increased illicit migrant ventures, disrupted eighteen (18) PRC nationals from illegally entering Guam and deterred two (2) other departures, and conducted four (4) RRS boardings in total, resulting in three (3) terminations due to inadequate and unsafe lifesaving equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, during Operation ISLAND CHIEF in 2022, Lieutenant Hofschneider patrolled eight thousand one hundred and twenty-four (8,124) NMs throughout a historic forty-three (43) day Expeditionary Patrol across the EEZs of Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Australia, and the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM). He conducted fourteen (14) Right of Approaches, safely executed seven (7) port visits in Papua New Guinea (Manus, Rabaul, Port Moresby), Australia (Cairns), and Federated States of Micronesia (Pohnpei), making all these the first-ever FRC port visits, excluding Pohnpei. He completed twenty (20) shore-side engagements to include hosting two (2) U.S. Embassy Charge D'Affairs and D14 Commander, participating in two (2) school COMRELS, and meeting with numerous key stakeholders (military and government), and completed four (4) underway engagements, to include embarking PNG Defense Forces Ship riders for at-sea engagement, joint patrol with Australian Border Force of Torres Strait, and PASSEX with IMAS Melville, IMAS Wollongong, and RFNS Savenaca; and

**WHEREAS**, during Operation REMATAU in October and November 2022, Lieutenant Hofschneider patrolled one thousand nine hundred thirty-one (1,931) NMs across the high seas and the FSM EEZ; he off-loaded one thousand five hundred (1,500) pounds of donated supplies to the communities of Yap and Ulithi, to include one hundred fifty (150) PFDs; he executed the first-ever FRC port visits to Ulithi Atoll and Yap, FSM; and he conducted KLE with Yap's Council of Traditional Chiefs, the Council of Piling. He completed the SMEE with seventy (70) cadets and faculty from FSM's Fisheries and Maritime Institute; he conducted three (3) CG Recruiting Events, to include two (2) high school visits and the hosting of sixty-five (65) aspiring recruits for ship tours; and he participated in Yap's World Coconut Day celebration as an honorary guest; and

**WHEREAS**, during Operation REMATAU in November and December of 2022, Lieutenant Hofschneider executed LE operations with the MSST Honolulu detachment resulting in the completion of seven (7) RBS, four (4) UPVs, two (2) CPV boardings, and four (4) warnings issued. He validated proof-of-concept operations with NSWC SBT22 to include successful comms exercise and integration of USN PUMA UAV into CG operations. Lieutenant Hofschneider executed the first-ever FRC port visit to Tinian, CNMI, and he completed two (2) SMEEs with twelve (12) officers from the CNMI Customs and Biosecurity and five (5) officers from the Tinian Department of Public Safety – Boating Safety. He conducted three (3) COMRELS in Saipan and Tinian to include hosting sixty-eight (68) students from the Tasi-to-Table Non-Profit Organization and the Tinian Typhoon Association; and he supported CGRC initiatives to include a Swearing-In Ceremony for two (2) CG recruits and a follow-on Yap's field from Saipan to Tinian; and

**WHEREAS**, during Operation REMATAU from December 2022 to January 2023, Lieutenant Hofschneider patrolled one thousand one hundred sixty-seven (1,167) NMs within Guam and CNMI TTW; he completed seven (7) RBS and two (2) UPV boardings, resulting in one (1) termination and two (2) violations issued; and he provided coastal SRC coverage in the CNMI during six (6) high-sea advisory days. In February 2023, he supported a CGFM/SG Intel tasking by gathering visual information on AGI operating NW of Guam; and he completed four (4) port-visits in Saipan, Tinian, and Ulithi in Yap State, FSM, and the first-ever FRC port visit to Woleai in Yap State. Lieutenant Hofschneider off-loaded four thousand five hundred forty (4,540) pounds of donated supplies to Ulithi and Woleai and completed four (4) COMRELS in Tinian, Mogmog Island and Falalop Island of Ulithi, and Falalop Island of Woleai; and


**WHEREAS**, during Operation RAI BALANG in March and April 2023, Lieutenant Hofschneider patrolled five thousand plus (5,000+) NMs throughout a thirty-day (30) expeditionary patrol across the high seas and EEZs of Palau and FSM; he executed fourteen (14) boardings (nine (9) were Western and Central Pacific Fisheries Conservation and five (5) were U.S.-Palau Ship-riders), yielding thirteen (13) potential violations and one (1) potential serious violation. He completed four (4) port visits to include validating Hub-and-Spoke model with three (3) port visits to Koror, Palau; he conducted six (6) Engagements Concomitant to Operations, to include a PASSEX with FSS Tosiwo Nakayama, a SMEE with PSS Kedam, and four (4) COMRELS; and he hosted eighty (80) students during CG Recruiting Event; and

**WHEREAS**, Lieutenant Hofschneider completed CART, TSTA, OSI/OTI, CLEAR, and AIA Security Inspections, yielding flawless results and high praise from visiting inspectors. He led a crew to attain a ninety-nine percent (99%) CART/TSTA score which is a fleetwide FRC benchmark; he maintained peak operational readiness with zero unscheduled Charlie days; he completed four (4) ODMS packages; and he has had exceptional advocacy and response to five (5) mission-degrading casualties. Lieutenant Hofschneider served as the lone cutter representative during the final planning meeting prior to implementation of the Enhanced Shiprider Agreement, and he aided in the development of operating procedures and QRCs; and his change of command from Commanding Officer of the USCGC *OLIVER HENRY* (WPC 1140) will take place on May 19, 2023; now therefore, be it
