BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Consulate General Patrick John Uytiepo Hilado was born on February 25, 1972, in Bacolod City, Philippines. He attended the University of St. La Salle-Bacolod in 1985 for his elementary education and graduated as Valedictorian of his high school class in 1989. He continued his education at De La Salle University, earning a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science (BSCS) with a specialization in Information Technology and receiving the Student Leadership Award from De La Salle University in 1993; and

WHEREAS, in 1996, Consulate General Hilado completed the Foreign Service Officers Examinations for the Department of Foreign Affairs. He started a six-month Cadetship Program for Foreign Service Officers, Batch VI, Foreign Service Institute Department of Foreign Affairs. He was awarded the Rank of Officer for the Order of Lakandula. Patrick held several positions in the Department of Foreign Affairs over the next few years entering in April 1997 as a Foreign Service Officer, Class IV; Principal Assistant to the Office of Asian and Pacific Affairs (ASPAC) in October 1997; and Director, Coratel & MIS Division (CMISD) Office of the Secretary in June 2007. He passed his Career Ministers Examination for the Department of Foreign Affairs in 2011; and

WHEREAS, from November 2014 to February 2016, Consulate General Hilado became Special Assistant to the Deputy Director General for Conference Management Services 2015 APEC National Organizing Committee (APEC-NOC), Malacanang Palace, Manila. In February 2016, Consulate General Hilado became the Director of the Office of European Affairs, Department of Foreign Affairs in Manila, for three (3) months. He continued working at the Department of Foreign Affairs as Executive Director Office of Consular Affairs Manila in May 2016 and became Director, Information Technology Communications & Records Division (ITCRD) Office of Assets Management & Support Services in September 2016; and

WHEREAS, Consulate General Hilado held several positions in the Foreign Service before his term on Guam. In June 2000, he became the Third Secretary & Vice Consul Philippine Embassy, Port Moresby, Papua New Guinea, for three (3) years. He became the Vice Consul and Consul for the Philippine Consulate General Chicago, USA until June 2007. Patrick moved to Finland in June 2010 as First Secretary and Consul General Philippine Embassy, Helsinki, until October 2012. From November 2012 to November 2014, he was First Secretary Consul Minister and Consul General Philippine Embassy in Oslo, Norway. In April 2017, Patrick was Consul and then Deputy Consul General for the Philippine Consulate General Osaka, Japan; and

WHEREAS, Patrick strengthened public diplomacy efforts at the Philippine Consulate General in Osaka, tapping digital platforms and technology effectively to engage with and deliver key messages to stakeholders. In 2019, Patrick played a significant role in efforts to coordinate and harmonize administrative and consular policies and practices of Foreign Service Posts in Japan for improved delivery of services to the public, introduced and instituted new consular management systems at the Philippine Consulate General in Osaka from 2018-2020 utilizing the Department's online office suite tools to come up with systems which have resulted in improved data collection and transaction monitoring and tracking payments and mail for the Consulate. The systems have also streamlined back-end processes and have provided management with real-time information, ready reports, audit trails, and a dashboard containing critical performance indicators. Similar systems were subsequently introduced at the Philippine Consulate General in *Hagåtña* in 2021, which has resulted in similar benefits for both staff and the leadership team of the Consulate. Patrick obtained additional Language Proficiency in Japanese by passing the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT Level 5) in 2019; and

WHEREAS, in 2020, he led efforts at the Philippine Consulate General in Osaka for Post's transition to new normal operations in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, creating and rolling out new appointment systems for the Consulate which enabled Post to continue operations throughout most of the period of the pandemic, safely delivering consular services to stakeholders both at the Consulate's premises and in key areas for consular outreach; and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2021, Patrick received a Certificate of Commendation from Philippine Ambassador to Japan, H.E. Jose C. Laurel V, for his unwavering support for and participation in the various programs and projects of Team Philippines in Japan for devotion to duty and the call of public service, for the many initiatives to improve the delivery of the Consulate General's services and for dedication as a keeper of the public trust; and

WHEREAS, Patrick arrived in Guam on May 3, 2021, and led the Philippine Consulate General in Agaña, Guam, as Consul General and Head-of-Post. He managed operations to ensure continued delivery of critical consular and assistance-to-nationals (ATN) services throughout the pandemic and fully addressed within one (1) year from the assumption of office the problem of consular appointment backlogs for passport and other services; and

WHEREAS, Patrick directed and extended consular outreach service operations of Agaña PCG in off-island jurisdictions, including the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CMNI), the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, and the Republic of Palau to ensure that thousands of Filipinos residing in these remote areas who cannot travel due to the pandemic can still access passport and other much needed consular services. He promoted closer collaboration and stronger ties with the Government of the Federated States of Micronesia (FSM) to address concerns on the protection of Filipino workers in the FSM and work towards the eventual lifting of the labor deployment ban in the FSM; and

WHEREAS, Patrick spearheaded efforts for the efficient and effective conduct of overseas voting at the Philippine Consulate General in *Hagåtña*, Guam, for the May 2022 National Elections utilizing initiatives such as in-house voter and mail tracking systems and the conduct of hybrid mobile voting activities in off-island jurisdictions resulting to, and pushing voter turnouts in all jurisdictions of the Consulate General to historical highs and significantly reducing return-to-sender voting packets; and

WHEREAS, Patrick strengthened the Consulate General's efforts to support and assist Filipino H-2 workers deployed in Guam by closely collaborating with the Philippine Labor Office in Los Angeles, to organize on-site post-arrival seminars for H-2 workers and engage with local labor and government officials, employers, and other stakeholders to improve the deployment process and strengthen protections for Filipino workers. He worked toward the re-establishment of a new Migrant Workers Office (MWO) in Guam; now therefore, be it

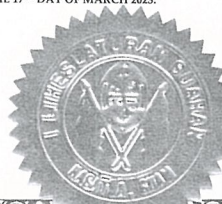


