BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, throughout every period of the history of the United States, women have proudly served the United States to secure and preserve freedom and liberty for the people of the United States and the allies of the United States; and

WHEREAS, women have formally been a part of the Armed Forces since the establishment of the Army Nurse Corps in 1901 but have informally served since the inception of the United States military; and

WHEREAS, the first Women Veterans Recognition Day was held on June 12, 2018, marking the Seventieth (70th) Year Anniversary of the groundbreaking Women's Armed Services Integration Act, signed into law by President Harry S. Truman on June 12, 1948; and

WHEREAS, since the signing of the Women's Armed Services Integration Act, which enabled women to serve as permanent, regular members of the United States Armed Forces, more than three million (3,000,000) women have served in the United States honorably and with courage on land, on sea, in the air, and space as members of the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Coast Guard, Air Force, and Space Force in roles such as nurses, physicians, physical therapists, air traffic controllers, intelligence specialists, communication specialists, logisticians, clerks, combat pilots, surface warfare sailors, submariners, artilleryists, air defenders, engineers, military police, civil affair specialists, and in all combat roles; and

WHEREAS, as of 2022, women constituted approximately 17.5% of Armed Forces members on active-duty, including 14.7% of active-duty members in the Army, 20.6% of active-duty members in the Navy, 9.4% of active-duty members in the Marine Corps, fifteen percent (15%) of active-duty personnel in the Coast Guard, 21.5% of active-duty members in the Air Force, which is the largest percentage of female active-duty members, and 19.4% of active-duty members in the Space Force. There are 4.9 female enlisted personnel for every female officer.; and

WHEREAS, as of 2022, women represented 21.6 percent of the selected reserve force, 19.9% of the Army National Guard Reserve Component, 25.4% of reserve members in the Army, twenty-seven percent (27%) of reserve members in the Navy, 3.8% of reserve members in the Marine Corps, 15.7% of reserve members in the Coast Guard, 22.1% of reserve members in the Air National Guard, 28.2% of reserve members in the Air Force, which is the largest percentage of female reserve members; and

WHEREAS, in 2023, the population of women veterans is more than 2,066,000, with women veterans being the fastest growing group in the veteran population, constituting approximately eleven percent (11%) of the total veteran population; and

WHEREAS, the United States is proud of and appreciates the service of all women veterans who have demonstrated great skill, sacrifice, and commitment to defending the principles upon which the United States was founded and which the United States continues to uphold; and

WHEREAS, by designating June 12 as "Women Veterans Recognition Day," *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* highlights the growing presence of women in the Armed Forces and National Guard and pay respect to women veterans for their patriotic military service; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize the observance of Women Veterans Recognition Day on June 12, 2024, as a time to remember the service and sacrifices of women veterans; and commend the great women veterans who have served bravely on behalf of the United States; and be it further




