WHEREAS, Rosario Flores Leon Guerrero was born in Hagåtña, Guam, and currently resides in the village of Chalan Pago. She married Pedro Baza Leon Guerrero on July 6, 1942, and they shared fifty-three (53) years of marriage together. Rosario and her husband Pedro have seven (7) children: Rosie L.G. Sgambelluri, Hilda L.G. Duncan, Lola L.G. Paulino, Sister Mary Rosario, Priscilla L.G. Manibusan, Josephine L.G. Santos, and Peter F. Leon Guerrero; and were also blessed with nineteen (19) grandchildren, twenty-two (22) great-grandchildren, and three (3) great-great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Rosario was a World War II survivor, and she had the determination to own and operate one of the first businesses in the new housing development of Sinajaña; and she was able to invest in several real estate developments, including land and residential properties; and

WHEREAS, Rosario supported her husband who served as a Senator in the First (1st) and Third (3rd) Guam Congress; and who also worked in several government positions such as a Principal for three (3) schools, Director of the Office of Economic Opportunity, and Director of Land Management; and

WHEREAS, Rosario owned and operated the "Tan Rosario Store" for thirty (30) years and made hundreds of financial and in-kind contributions to the community through neighborhood food programs and by serving meals at C.L. Taitano Elementary School in Sinajaña; and she donated the remaining food to the senior citizens and to needy families, especially to women and children; and

WHEREAS, Rosario was a devout Catholic and she had served in several religious organizations that serve the community; and she was a leader in the Christian faith for more than seventy-five (75) years; and

WHEREAS, one of Rosario's daughters is a Carmelite nun who celebrates fifty-three (53) years of service to the Roman Catholic mendicant religious order founded in the twelfth (12th) century, and is based in St. Louis, Missouri; and
