**WHEREAS**, Major Sean Fay first entered military service in 1995 enlisting in the U.S. Navy and attending the U.S. Naval Academy Preparatory School, with follow-on attendance and graduation from the U.S. Naval Academy in Annapolis, Maryland; and

**WHEREAS**, in August 2000, Major Sean Fay was commissioned as a U.S. Marine Corps Second (2<sup>nd</sup>) Lieutenant, after which he completed the Basic Officer Course and reported to the U.S. Navy Flight School at Naval Air Stations in Pensacola, Florida and Corpus Christi, Texas and becoming a Naval Aviator in February of 2003; and

**WHEREAS**, following flight school while serving as First (1<sup>st</sup>) Lieutenant, Fay completed the prescribed flight training for designation as a UH-1N Huey pilot at Marine Helicopter Squadron 303, and subsequently reported to Marine Light Attack Helicopter Squadron (HMLA) 367 "Scarface"; and

**WHEREAS**, while with Scarface, 1<sup>st</sup> Lieutenant Fay served as the Human Resources Officer and the Phase Crew Officer in Charge and deployed with the squadron in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from 2004 to 2005 at Al Taqaddam, Iraq, eventually becoming a Captain after the squadron's return and being redeployed with Scarface in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom to Al Taqaddam and Al Qa'im, Iraq from 2006 to 2007; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2007 while serving as Captain, Sean Fay reported to 1<sup>st</sup> Air Naval Gunfire Liaison Company aboard Camp Pendleton, California, where he served as a Forward Air Controller (FAC), a Firepower Control Team Leader, and Supporting Arms Liaison Team Air Officer before being assigned to a Port of Entry Advisor Team and deployed to Al Waleed, Iraq as a Customs Police Advisor in 2008; and

**WHEREAS**, during this deployment, Captain Fay was reassigned as a FAC to Task Force Mech, where he supported the 4<sup>th</sup> Tank Battalion and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion as they conducted operations in Al Anbar Province, Iraq; and

**WHEREAS**, Captain Fay returned from Iraq in 2008 and reported to Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron (H&HS) at the U.S. Marine Corps Air Station in Yuma, Arizona, serving as the Aircraft Maintenance Officer and Aviation Safety Officer with primary duties involving flying in support of the U.S. Marine Corps' only inland Search and Rescue detachment from 2009 to 2013, and becoming promoted to his present rank of Major in 2012; and

**WHEREAS**, upon completion of his tour with H&HS Yuma, Major Fay reported to Marine Aircraft Group (MAG) 39 aboard Camp Pendleton, California, where he was subsequently assigned to I Marine Expeditionary Force (MEF) as the Security Force Assistance Officer deployed to Regional Command – Southwest in Helmand Province, Afghanistan in support of Operation Enduring Freedom from 2013 to 2014, and served as the liaison between the Brigade and Division level Security Force Assistance Advisor Teams (SFAAT) and the MEF, with primary duties involving acquiring, tracking, and reporting all manner of support to the SFAATs as they turned over operational control of Helmand and Nimroz Provinces to the Afghan National Army in 2014; and

**WHEREAS**, after returning from Afghanistan, Major Fay reported to HMLA 369 "Gunfighters" aboard Camp Pendleton, California, where he transitioned from the UH-1N to the UH-1Y Huey and served as the squadron's Administrative Officer from 2014 to 2016, after which Major Sean Fay reported to Expeditionary Warfare Training Group Atlantic (EWTG-ANT) in Little Creek, Virginia, serving as the Tactical Air Control Party (TACP) Course Manager, training prospective FACs and Joint Terminal Attack Controllers (JTAC) from across the U.S. Department of Defense and partner nations whose JTACs perform the duties of controlling aircraft, artillery, and naval gunfire in support of friendly forces' scheme of maneuver; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2018, Major Fay returned to Camp Pendleton, California and served as the Executive Officer for Marine Wing Support Squadron 372 "Diamondbacks" and as the Aviation Safety Officer for MAG 39 before reporting to Marine Corps Activity Guam, now known as Marine Corps Base Camp Blaz, in September 2020, where he performed the duties of both an Assistant Operations Officer and as the Aviation Operations Officer in support of all transient USMC operational forces and partner nation forces operating in support of major exercises, as well as operational commitments from Guam; and

**WHEREAS**, Major Sean Fay will retire from Camp Blaz Marine Corps Base, Guam, having completed twenty-five (25) years of active military service, with personal decorations including the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal with two gold stars, the Air Medal with "11" Strike Flight award, and the Meritorious Service Medal; now therefore, be it
