**Relative to recognizing Willi Carl Byerly for his commitment of over thirty (30) years in the sport of surfing and bodyboarding on Guam; and commending him for his dedication as president at Guåhan Nāpu Inc. from 2004 to 2017.**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:**

**WHEREAS**, Willi Byerly was born Willi Carl Marchslewski in the city of Worms in the Rheinessen-Rheinfalz region of Germany, raised by his mother, Wanda Marchslewski, his maternal grandmother, and his uncle. Willi's mother married Henry Byerly of Montana and moved to America in 1960; and

**WHEREAS**, as military dependents, Willi and his mother moved around and lived in different parts of the U.S. and overseas, and it was his early teen years in Hawaii and teen years in San Diego, Guam, and England that shaped and influenced his long relationship with the ocean; and

**WHEREAS**, he first learned to surf at Piliiaui Army Recreation Center in Waiānae, Oahu, from ages twelve (12) to fourteen (14) and spent a year in Ocean Beach, San Diego, partaking in Californian surf culture, arriving on Guam in 1968 with his mother and his second stepfather, Emeterio "Ted" Santos, a Chamorro naval officer from Guam; and

**WHEREAS**, Willi and a cohort of Guam's surfers from the 1960s first organized an early chapter of the Guam Surfing Association in 1975 to protest the construction of two breakwaters at the *Agaña* Boat Basin when the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the administration had wanted to extend the break wall through the popular left side surfing spot at Boat Basin, resulting in the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers shortening the length of the breakwater jetties and, as a result of Willi and the early generation of Guam activist surfers, the Boat Basin remains one of Guam's favorite surf spots for recreation and competitive surfing; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1978, Willi and the older generation of Guam surfers re-constituted themselves when another group suggested that the U.S. Navy build an ammunition wharf at the Glass Breakwater called "Magundas" rather than Orote Point. The revived association succeeded in convincing the officials to make the ammunition wharf at Orote Point, and Magundas remains a surfable site to this day, again thanks to Byerly and his fellow surfers' activism; and

**WHEREAS**, in 2003, he and several younger generation surfers and body-boarders came together to brainstorm and initiate the formation of a new association, becoming *Guåhan Nāpu* or "Guam Wave" to encompass all types of wave riders; and

**WHEREAS**, the *Guåhan Nāpu* surfing association accomplished many things within a year: formally incorporated as a non-profit community organization on January 26, 2004, becoming *Guåhan Nāpu Inc.* (GNI); held its first surfing contest as Fluid 2004 Surf Fest *Hagåtña* Boat Basin; provided surfboards for the Beach Boys concert for Atkin Kroll's ninetieth (90<sup>th</sup>) Anniversary; and proposed and obtained approval for a surf mural to be painted on the Paseo de Susana Statue of Liberty Beach Park bathroom walls as GNI's beautification project, executed by GNI member, Tom Adame; and

**WHEREAS**, during the 2004 board election, Willi was elected president of *Guåhan Nāpu Inc.* and was consecutively voted president for the next thirteen (13) years; and

**WHEREAS**, Willi sat on the Guam Visitors Bureau's (GVB) Beach Safety Committee and participated in GVB's first series of beach safety meetings, resulting in the first placement of beach safety signs and flags. He represented GNI as a participant in GVB's Ocean Safety advisory committee which resulted in the building of the lifeguard tower at *Matapang* Beach; organized Battle of the Board Riders 3 *Hagåtña* Boat Basin; organized and hosted the Kids Grommet Standup Paddle Boarding Competition ages 6-15 held at *Ypao* Beach; and donated a T.V. to Guam Memorial Hospital for the fourth (4<sup>th</sup>) floor lobby area of the Children's Pediatric Unit with GNI, their major sporting and community outreach events garnering press coverage for GNI and solidifying the association's status in Guam's sporting community; and

**WHEREAS**, Willi and GNI organized the Pro-Am surfing and bodyboarding competition and entered a team at the La Union, Philippines longboard contest; organized and held the first Rick's Reef Classic surf contest on February 16, 2008, solicited up to a dozen sponsors for prizes and donations in-kind, where forty (40) contestants signed up for the competition; and

**WHEREAS**, GNI received an invitation from the New Caledonia Surfing League to participate in the 2011 Pacific Games surfing competition three (3) years before the Games, and when the Port Authority of Guam restricted entry by surfers to Glass Breakwater from Family Beach, Byerly, and GNI communicated with and obtained access to Magundas from the U.S. Naval Base Commanding Officer; and

**WHEREAS**, in December 2010, Willi traveled to New Caledonia to meet representatives of the New Caledonia Surfing League and do a survey of the 2011 Pacific Games surfing site at Ouano (La Foa) in anticipation that Guam surfers will be part of the Guam contingent in the South Pacific Games; and

**WHEREAS**, over the years, Willi and the GNI organized several Rick's Reef Classic and Surf the Basin competitions; repaired *Paseo* shower area after another storm surge; sponsored and sent two junior surfers to Japan for the Isonoura Kids Surfing contest in Wakayama, Japan; donated two (2) wheelchairs to the Guam Memorial Hospital; supported the Freak Show Body Boarding contest; was invited by Guam National Olympic Committee (GNOC) to send a surfing team to the 2011 Pacific Games in New Caledonia; held the Pacific Games qualifiers to short list surf athletes for the 2011 Pacific Games; sent a team to the New Caledonia Pacific Games; became a non-voting member of International Surfing Association (ISA); helped send two (2) junior surfers and two (2) body boarders to Hawaii for the Sandy Beach Body Board and Surfing Competition; assisted with and participated in the first (1<sup>st</sup>) Ka'hulo water safety program at *Matapang* Beach; were invited to send a Guam team to the Melanesian Surfing Cup in Fiji; sent a team to the Melanesian Surfing Cup competition at Cloud Break; was accepted as a non-voting member of the GNOC; helped with the Lotus Surf Shop Kids Surf Competition at *Talo'fo'fo* Bay; was certified by the ISA to conduct surf judging on Guam versus going off island; renegotiated with U.S. Naval Base Command for access to Magandus to include fishing and limited recreational activities; received the Governor's Award in recognition and appreciation of GNI's "work to promote surfing as a water sport and recreational activity for residents of all ages" and for the organization's civic responsibility "to make the island a better place for all Guamanians" with its various community outreach activities and donations since the association's inception; sent a four (4)-member contingent to the 1<sup>st</sup> ISA International Surf Coaching development seminar in Bali; and partnered with Lotus Surf Shop to facilitate the *Hāfa* Surf Series contest at *Talo'fo'fo* Bay; and

**WHEREAS**, GNI was formally recognized by the GNOC as Guam's surfing federation, where Willi was credited for lobbying and maintaining consistent communication with the GNOC president on getting GNI recognized; and

**WHEREAS**, GNI obtained a fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000) sponsorship from GVB to facilitate the Guam Fire Department's Rescue Watercraft (RWC) Course in January of 2016; took part in the U.S. Coast Guard's Search & Rescue (SAR) Annual Training Exercise; facilitated the purchase of specialized surf rescue equipment; enrolled two members for the GFD RWC course and another two members for U.S. Coast Guard's SAR training exercise; and, in February of 2017, GNI members were recognized by *Adelph* as "Heroes of Guåhan" for helping to rescue distressed canoers at Boat Basin; and

**WHEREAS**, GNI received an official letter from the ISA president confirming recognition that GNI is Guam's national federation "with the rights and responsibilities to govern Surfing in all its forms, including Standup Paddle (SUP), across its national Territory;" and

**WHEREAS**, before his 65<sup>th</sup> birthday, Willi organized and helmed the tenth (10<sup>th</sup>) and his last Rick's Reef Classic surf competition, and, in August 2017, he stepped down as president of GNI to turn the reins over to a new slate of officers and was acknowledged and commended for his leadership of the GNI by GNOC President, Ricardo Blas; and

**WHEREAS**, as advisor emeritus to GNI's new board of officers, he provided institutional knowledge, co-led and was co-team manager of Team Guam at the 2019 International Surfing Association's World Surfing Games in Miyazaki, Japan, a qualifier for the Tokyo 2020 Olympics where surfing was included as one of the sports for the first 1<sup>st</sup> time ever, now therefore, be it
