1 BE IT RESOLVED BY *I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN*
2 *GUÅHAN*:

1 **WHEREAS**, Mrs. Marie Elaine C. Ayuyu was born on February 25, 1952, in the
2 serene village of Sinajana. She is the eldest of six children and the daughter of the late
3 David C. Camacho and Concepcion Camacho; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Marie, best known as “Elaine”, began her educational path
5 attending Bishop Baumgartner Memorial Elementary School and George Washington
6 High School. Elaine always took her education seriously, making her family proud of
7 her accomplishments; and

8 **WHEREAS**, after graduation, Elaine began working full-time at Bank of
9 America and part-time as an agent at Budget Car Rental; and

10 **WHEREAS**, during her busy career, Marie met and married her soul-mate and
11 better half, Roman Chong Ayuyu, who was originally from Saipan. Although Elaine
12 had a very busy schedule, she still took care of her family. Elaine and Roman soon
13 became proud parents with the birth of their three sons: Matthew, Roman Junior and
14 Anthony. All boys have emulated the teachings and examples shown to them by their
15 parents. Elaine is also a proud grandmother of five grandchildren. She also enjoys her
16 weekends at her private beach property in Anderson (Jinapsan) where cleaning and
17 relaxing was therapeutic in soothing her mind from work and other stressors; and

18 **WHEREAS**, Elaine entered the Government of Guam workforce when she was
19 hired as an Accounting Technician I with the Department of Public Health and Social
20 Services (DPSS) on June 25, 1979. She worked her way up and was promoted on July
21 1, 1990, to the position of Accounting Technician Supervisor. On January 3, 2000,
22 Elaine was detailed as an Accountant II to the Department of Administration (DOA).
23 After holding various detail appointments at DOA, Elaine was eventually promoted to
24 Management Analyst III on February 17, 2005; and

25 **WHEREAS**, throughout Elaine’s career with the Department of Administration,
26 she served as the department primary Rapid Action Coordinator (RAC) during the
27 declaration of emergencies and disasters. She spent many days and nights away from
28 her family assigned to the Guam Homeland Security/Office of Civil Defense to provide
29 administrative and operational assistance. One of the most noteworthy dedications was

1 during the year 2002, when the island of Guam was hit by a series of back-to-back
2 typhoons. The Housing Management Staff was tasked to monitor and watch over the
3 large generators set up at the Department of Administration Building in Hagåtña. Elaine
4 was the designated supervisor in charge to man the generators day and night making
5 sure the operations of the department were never compromised. That was teamwork at
6 its best; and

7 **WHEREAS**, during Elaine’s service with the Department of Administration, she
8 was often (if not always) chosen by former governors, department directors, deputy
9 directors, and administrators to oversee government-wide department activities such as:
10 representing DOA as part of an assessment team for the aftermath of major typhoons,
11 Chamorro Week, Government Employee Recognition Week, Labor Day, Liberation
12 activities, Governor’s Adopt-a-School, Relay-for-life, the annual General Services
13 Agency stock inventory, the “Lola Cola” Cost of Living check distribution; and many
14 other employees morale-boosting activities; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Elaine leaves a lasting legacy amongst her professional colleagues,
16 friends and family that will continue even as she proudly retires from a noteworthy
17 career with the Department of Administration. The department will surely feel the loss
18 of Elaine’s hard work and pride together made her both motivational and inspirational
19 to those whose lives she has touched; and

20 **WHEREFEAS**, Elaine has also dedicated much of her spare time as a dedicated,
21 active and devout Catholic and a parishioner of the St. Jude Church in Sinajana; and
22 has been assisting with the preparation of mass, organization of parish activities,
23 cleaning and assisting with various projects of the St. Jude Church. You will find her
24 at 6:00 am Sunday Mass as one of the ushers assisting parishioners, as well as counting
25 the monetary donations after mass. She is also very active in the Sinajana community
26 assisting whenever and wherever needed, most especially during Fiesta time; and

27 **WHEREAS**, Elaine has selflessly dedicated many years of her life in public
28 service for Guam and its people, now therefore, be it

1 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'trentai Siette Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby,
2 on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend Mrs. Marie Elaine C. Ayuyu
3 dedicating over Forty-Five (45) years of Government Service to the People of Guam;
4 and be it further

5 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the
6 adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Mrs. Marie
7 Elaine C. Ayuyu; and to the Honorable Lourdes A. Leon Guerrero, *I Maga'hågan*
8 *Guåhan*.
