Relative to posthumously recognizing the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo, former Governor of Guam, for his dedication to the island of Guam, and commemorating his legacy of service; and expressing condolences to his family on his passing, on behalf of the people of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI SIETTE NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo, the third elected Governor of Guam, was born on July 25, 1934, in *Hagåtña*, Guam; and is the eldest of the three (3) sons of the late Eduardo "Jake" Torres Calvo and the late Veronica Mariano McDonald Calvo; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo attended *Agaña Heights* Elementary School; he studied for two (2) years at George Washington High School on Guam; he completed his secondary education at the Peacock Military Academy in San Antonio, Texas; and he further advanced his academic pursuits at the University of Santa Clara in California, where he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Commerce in 1958; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo and Rosa Herrero Baza, daughter of the late Antonio and Dolores Herrero Baza, entered into matrimony on July 28, 1956, which was officiated by the late Father Kieran Hickey, OFM Cap, at St. Jude Thaddeus Catholic Church in *Sinajana*, Guam; and throughout their sixty-eight (68) years together, their journey reflected a deep mutual respect and unwavering support for one another, demonstrating the enduring bonds, strength, and graces of the Sacrament of Matrimony; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo and Mrs. Rosa Baza Calvo exemplified the life-giving love of family through their legacy of faith, their commitment to the teachings of the Catholic Church, and their dedication to acts of charity and service, which not only served as a guiding light but instilled deeply-rooted values in their eight (8) children and families: Vera Calvo and Fabian Garces; Kathy Calvo and Andre Leon Guerrero; Paul Calvo, Jr. and Shelly Vargas; former Governor Eddie Calvo and Christine Sonido; Barbara Calvo and Mark Damron; Marie Calvo and Mike Benito; Reyna Calvo; and Clare Calvo, who continued their legacy of faith, compassion, and unity through their twenty-four (24) grandchildren and twenty-six (26) great-grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo and Mrs. Rosa Baza Calvo epitomized the spirit, strength, and resilience of Guam's greatest generation, as they endured and witnessed unspeakable atrocities during the Japanese occupation of Guam from December 11, 1941 to July 21, 1944, and often shared their stories of survival with their family to inspire understanding and remembrance of the past, such as the late Honorable Paul enduring beatings in school and Mrs. Rosa's forced march to the *Manenggon* concentration camp, who recalled the moment the U.S. Marines guided them out of the *Manenggon* concentration camp to safety amidst the horrors of war, and highlighted their unwavering patriotism and commitment to justice; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo, a man of faith, integrity, dedication, hard-work, ambition, and self-discipline, was deeply influenced by the legacy of his father, Eduardo "Jake" Calvo, who, upon his passing in 1963, entrusted considerable business interests to his sons: Paul, who became president and chairman of Calvo's Insurance, Eduardo, and Thomas "Jerry" paving the way for the success of Calvo's Enterprises, a testament to the honor of his father's trust and the weight of his legacy; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo began his political career serving as a Senator of *I Mina'Ocho na Liheslaturan Guåhan* in 1964 under the Territorial Party of Guam, which later evolved into the Republican Party of Guam in 1966, and secured his place in politics with the highest number of votes in his first election and hit the ground running as the Vice Chairman of the Committee on Crime and Corruption, and as a member of the Committee on Rules, the Committee on Economic Development, and the Committee on Water and Utilities; and he was re-elected by the people of Guam in 1970 and 1972 to continue his public service as a Senator, taking on key roles as the Minority Leader in *I Mina'Onse na Liheslaturan Guåhan* and *I Mina'Dosse na Liheslaturan Guåhan*, and served as the Chairman of the Committee on Finance and Taxation; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo was a trailblazer in the business community and a dedicated public servant whose unwavering commitment to the people of Guam shaped his tenure as past Chairman of the Territorial Party of Guam and past State Chairman and a founding member of the Republican Party of Guam, where he advanced our shared values and always took a principled stance with every role he accepted, from the Guam delegation to the GOP Presidential Nominating Conventions in 1972, 1976, and 1980, to his recognition in "Who's Who in American Politics," and to his historic endorsement of Governor Ronald Reagan for the Presidency in 1980, which was a testament to his profound influence and impact on Guam's political landscape; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo was a true statesman, a beacon of unwavering dedication and selfless service to our people and our island, who would always tell you what is true, even if it is not popular, and his life of public service was a testament to the values of humility, courage, and integrity, and his legacy continues to inspire us all because he embodied the essence of greatness, and understood the weight of responsibility that accompanies leadership, as he often proclaimed, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded; and from the one who has been entrusted with much, much more will be asked"; and



WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo, a champion of Guam's economic growth, development, and prosperity, assumed office as the third elected Governor of Guam from 1979 to 1983, and fearlessly confronted the government of Guam's deficit, effecting a monumental reduction of \$27 Million Dollars in his first year in office, and spearheaded groundbreaking advancements in Guam's infrastructure, overseeing the modernization and reconstruction of our communications network, improvements to roads and village streets, and enhancements to our power grid, water supply, and wastewater systems; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo assumed his role as the first commander-in-chief of the Guam National Guard on December 24, 1980, and led the official establishment of its command headquarters on July 21, 1981, with the dedication and commitment of thirty-two (32) charter members who bravely answered the call to safeguard our island and nation; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo advocated for strategic investments that would serve as the bedrock for unlocking economic opportunities and fostering competitiveness necessary to rebuild Guam's economy; and through his visionary initiatives, which include the establishment of a robust tuna-fishing fleet, the development of a thriving garment manufacturing industry, and the construction of hotels, they were all aimed at revitalizing Guam's economy, instilling unwavering confidence in investors and the private sector, and cultivating enduring partnerships between the private sector, the government of Guam, and our beloved island community; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo was actively involved in various regional organizations in Micronesia, where he served three (3) terms as Chairman of the Association of Chief Executives of the Pacific Basin, which included the Governors of Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Pohnpei, Kosrae, Yap, Chuuk, as well as the Presidents of the Republic of Palau, the Marshall Islands, and Nauru; and he was a Charter Member and Vice Chairman of the Pacific Basin Development Council, which included the Governors of Hawaii, American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, and Guam; and

WHEREAS, after his term as Governor ended, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo continued to be influential in Guam's politics under the Republican Party because he believed that Guam's future rested on a foundation of responsibility, character, and family commitment; and it required him to continue to lead as President and Chairman of Calvo Enterprises Inc., where he led a diverse group of businesses providing essential services and employing hundreds of local residents, including Calvo's Insurance Underwriters, Pacific Construction Company, Mid-Pacific Liquor Distributing Company, Pepsi Cola Bottling Company of Guam, Payless Supermarkets, Market Wholesale Inc., KUAM, Calvo Finance Company, and Calvo Realty Management; and

WHEREAS, the late Honorable Paul McDonald Calvo had spent much of his time actively helping the people of *Guåhan* through his contributions in numerous civic, community, and religious activities; now therefore, be it
