Håfa Adai Madame Speaker,

Bill No. 79-37 (COR) amends Guam's Criminal Correctional Code by mandating imprisonment of no less than ten (10) years and no more than twenty-five (25) years when a firearm is unlawfully possessed or used during the commission of a felony in addition to the punishment imposed for the commission of the felony. The current law contains a sentencing enhancement of five (5) to twenty-five (25) years for unlawfully possessing or using a deadly weapon in commission of a felony, in addition to the punishment imposed for the commission of the felony.

Our Administration supports preventing and deterring violent crimes in our community, and we recognize that firearms cause severe injury to victims of crime. For this reason, I am signing Bill No. 79-37 (COR) into law as *Public Law No. 37-37*.

AN ACT TO AMEND § 80.37(a)(1) OF ARTICLE 2, CHAPTER 80, TITLE 9, GUAM CODE ANNOTATED, RELATIVE TO A SPECIAL ALLEGATION OF POSSESSION AND USE OF A DEADLY WEAPON IN THE COMMISSION OF A FELONY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF GUAM:

Section 1. Legislative Findings and Intent. I Liheslaturan Guåhan has taken note of the increased use of firearms in the commission of felonies, as well as in crimes related to controlled substances. Within a very short time prior to the introduction of this bill, violent crimes have occurred in two (2) of our southern villages involving firearms, one (1) of which resulted in a death. I Liheslaturan

Guåhan further finds that those criminals who will use lethal force in the commission of a felony represent a particular danger to the people of Guam and those who would use a particularly dangerous instrument, such as a firearm, merit an increased punishment which removes them as a source of danger to Guam.

**Section 2.** § 80.37(a)(1) of Article 2, Chapter 80, Title 9, Guam Code Annotated, is *amended* to read:

### "§ 80.37. Deadly Weapons Used in Felonies; Sentence.

- (a) Whoever unlawfully possesses or uses a deadly weapon in the commission of a felony punishable under the laws of Guam shall,
  - (1) in addition to the punishment imposed for the commission of such felony, be imprisoned for a term of not less than five (5) years nor more than twenty-five (25) years; and whoever unlawfully possesses or uses a firearm, as that term is defined in Title 10 Guam Code Annotated § 60100(a), in the commission of a felony punishable under the laws of Guam shall, in addition to the punishment imposed for the commission of such felony, be imprisoned for a term of not less than ten (10) years nor more than twenty-five (25) years; and"

**Section 3. Severability.** If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.
