
Bill No. 153-37 (LS) amends Guam's criminal code by mandating imprisonment of no less than ten (10) years and no more than twenty-five (25) years when an explosive or an improvised explosive device is unlawfully possessed or used during the commission of a felony in addition to the punishment imposed for the commission of the felony. The current law contains a sentencing enhancement of five (5) to twenty-five (25) years for unlawfully possessing or using a deadly weapon in commission of a felony, in addition to the punishment imposed for the commission of the felony.

While the existing provision mandates a sentencing enhancement for criminals who possess a deadly weapon in the commission of a felony, it is unclear whether the use of explosive devices is covered under this provision. The enactment of this bill would provide clarity in the enforcement of the existing provision, and protect the people of Guam by preventing and deterring the use of explosive devices.

Section 2. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Act shall be effective upon enactment.
